## Recommendations from Principal Palladino WHS

Principal Palladino presented the following changes to the Student Code of Conduct 2011-2012:

- dress code, page 8
- free/reduced duplicate words
- page 9 last paragraph change order of sentence regarding dress code
- electronic media communication device changes texting during lunch only as a one year trial paragraph 2 should say shut off.

Dr. Rabinovitch was in favor of the changes presented.

<u>Senior Privileges</u> – Principal Palladino requested to allow senior privileges on the first day of school due to changes in scheduling, requiring student to take eight classes and budget cuts. There are roughly 50 students eligible at this time.

Mrs. Veugen suggested adding the words "and student" in the last paragraph after "best interest of the school" and to add "email address".

There was discussion on block scheduling and how does a senior have no class. Suggestions included having coops, internships, and dual enrollment in place any voids in their schedules.

Principal Palladino stated that the library will be open for these students and previously Senior Privileges started the 2<sup>nd</sup> term in November.

Mrs. Veugen moved to grant senior privileges as requested, seconded by Ms. Gillette

VOTE: yea - 4; nay - 1(Dr. Sylvia); abstain - 0

Ms. Gillette moved to approve the Student Code of Conduct, seconded by Dr. Sylvia. The motion and second was then withdrawn.

Athletic Eligibility – Principal Palladino cited the MIAA rule of passing four classes for athletic eligibility. He requested requiring Wareham students to pass six out of eight classes or a 75% requirement. The AD is in full support of his recommendation.

After discussion Dr. Sylvia moved to approve the Student Code of Conduct for 2011-2012 including Athletic Eligibility, seconded by Ms. Gillette.

Acting Chair Swett announced that the meeting was recessed in order to enter into executive session. The Committee will be returning for the remainder of the agenda.

## **Financial Reports**

Ms. Miranda, Director of Operation/Finance, presented the FY11 LEA budget summary. All net and non net funds were expended. 66% of the school budget is invested in teaching services. She presented a staff breakdown in terms of funding sources, student data population, the budget by programs, by salaries, and by object, a breakdown of supply costs, and a 3 year comparison in the major accounts for FY'09, FY'10 and FY'11.

Ms. Miranda then explained how the deficit was covered for our transportation account.

She presented the revenue account balances for School Lunch, Full-Day Kindergarten, School Choice, Transportation, and Athletics revolving accounts.

Mr. Fontes moved to go beyond of hour of 10:00 p.m. to complete the superintendent's self-evaluation, seconded by Mrs. Veugen.

The remaining items on the agenda will be discussed at the next meeting.

## Superintendent of Schools Self-Evaluation

Dr. Rabinovitch gave a brief presentation on his self-evaluation. He thanked the three directors for their help as a group project for these goals, the principals' roles and all employees.

Dr. Sylvia moved to accept Dr. Rabinovitch's recommendation on the weight of goals, second by Mrs. Veugen.
