Report of Board of Education.

During the past year, schools have been mantained as follows. Center district, twenty-four weeks; East Washington, twenty weeks; New Boston district, twelve weeks; Mountain District twelve weeks; Turnpike district twenty-one weeks; Russell's Mill district, twenty-one weeks; North district nineteen weeks.

In districts maintaining but one term of school the scholars were allowed to attend the schools kept in the adjoining districts free of charge, that the spirit of the law might be carried out which requires equal school privileges for the children in all parts of the town.

The school at the Centre district secured three extra weeks of school by virtue of the Penniman fund. The inhabitants of the Brooks district choosing to send their children to the village school, no school has been mantained in that district the past year. The income of the Penniman fund in that district is therefore unexpended. It is suggested that the town assertain the conditions upon which the district holds this fund, that its income may be put to some use.

In general, the schools have been well taught, and good progress has been made. By this we do not intend to convey the idea that that they have been faultless, but that there have been as few poor schools as could be expected.

Some substantial improvements have been made upon the school buildings the past year. The school houses in the mountain district and at Russell's Mill have been painted; the shed at the Center district has been thoroughly repaired and painted; improvements have been made upon the grounds around the buildings on the Turnpike; new blackboards have been provided for the school house at East Washington, and the school room has been papered.

The teacher and scholars of this school, from the proceeds of a literary entertainment, very much improved the school room by the purchase of a clock, table, chairs, and five books of reference.

Ere long something in the way of repairs or a new building, will be repaired in the vicinity of the Advent Meeting-house.

A short report of the different schools is appended, also the report of the treasurer of the Board.

GEORGE N. GAGE, JESSE F. BAILEY, SUMNER N. BALL. School Board of Washington.

DIVISION NO. 1.

Both terms of this school were taught by Miss Eldora S. Farnsworth. Miss Farnsworth fully sustained her former good reputation as a teacher, and the examination at the close of second term indicated thorough instruction on the part of teacher, and a commendable degree of self-application on the part of scholars.

The greatest obstacle in the way of securing the best results in this school, we think, lies at the door of the parents in not sending more punctually, and in season to avoid tardiness. There are noble exceptions to this seeming indifference. The register in this division ought to awaken a livelier interest in the mind of every one who has scholars to send. This school had three weeks extra on account of a local fund for its benefit. In all 24 weeks.
