

REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD.

All things considered, the work of the past year compares favorably with that of preceding years.

We were fortunate in securing the services of experienced and faithful teachers for all our schools, and, in every school in town, a reasonable degree of success was noted. Some truths have been impressed upon us as never before.

We have realized more than ever the lack of system in our ungraded rural schools. The absence of a well planned course of study, in which promotions are made according to the proficiency of the pupil, leads every pupil to choose his own work, and to a great extent make his own promotions regardless of fitness.

Perhaps, with the limited means at our command, this defect cannot be wholly avoided, but anything tending to make the work of our schools more systematic, will be a step in the right direction.

We have realized this year, as in many past, the great necessity of co-operation of parents, teachers, scholars and school officers in the management of our schools. With it a school can hardly fail of success; and, without it, complete success is almost impossible. This idea of harmonious action is no more applicable to the management of schools than to any other public business, and we cannot too strongly emphasize the need of it.

There seems to be an increasing scarcity of well-qualified teachers, especially those who are willing to work for the small wages we are able to pay. This would suggest to us the necesity of larger appropriations of money, or a reduction of the number of our schools to the lowest possible number.

. There has been a reasonable compliance with the law relating to attendance of children in the publicschools, and no violation of the law has been noted.

Reports of the different schools in detail, the report of the treasurer, and the roll of perfect attendance are appended.

SPECIAL REPORT BY SCHOOLS.

SCHOOL No. 1. (Center.)

The Spring term of eight weeks was taught by Miss Anna G. Sumner, of Hill, N. H.

Miss Hill is an excellent scholar and a teacher of experience. Her methods of imparting instruction were highly commendable, but owing largely to a lack of support by the parents, the discipline was not what we could desire, and a change of teachers was deemed advisable.

The Fall term of eight weeks was taught by Mr. Merton G. Farnsworth, who succeeded in restoring discipline, and a profitable school was the result. On account of Mr. Farnsworth receiving an offer of a higher salary in another situation, we were obliged to again make a change of teachers.

Winter term also of eight weeks was taught by Miss Mary C. Holt, of Sunapee.

Miss Holt had previously been employed as teacher in this school, and the progress in the present term was fully up to the standard of her former success.


