

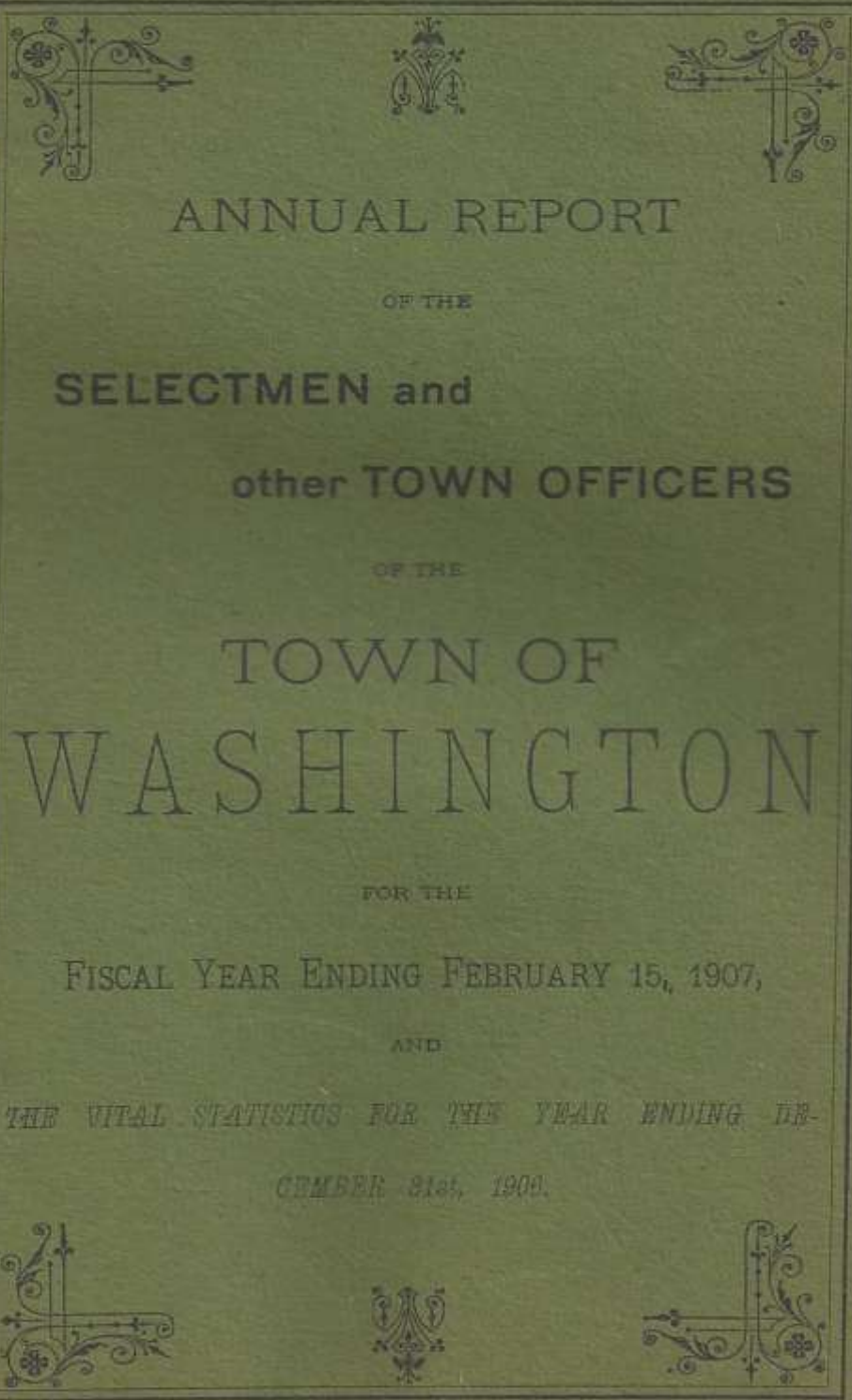

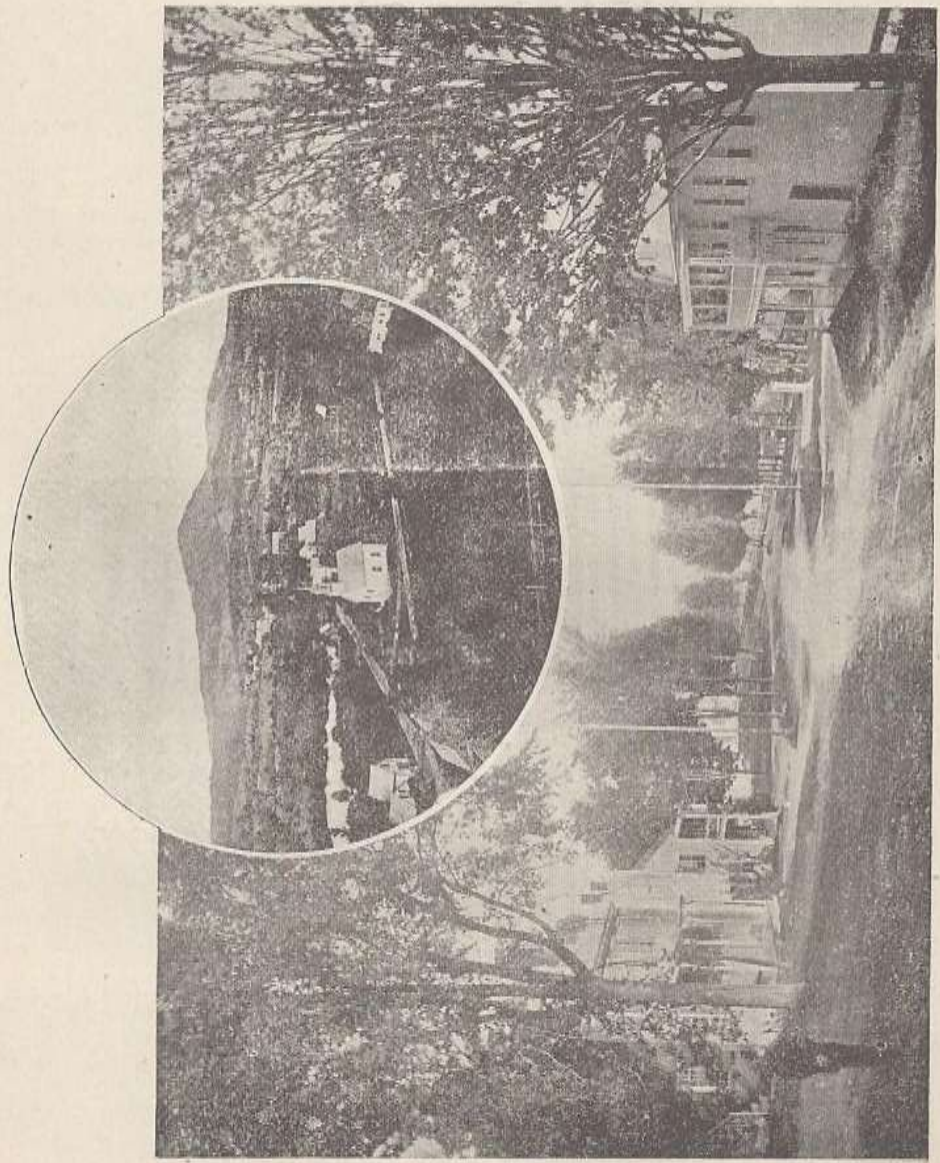

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

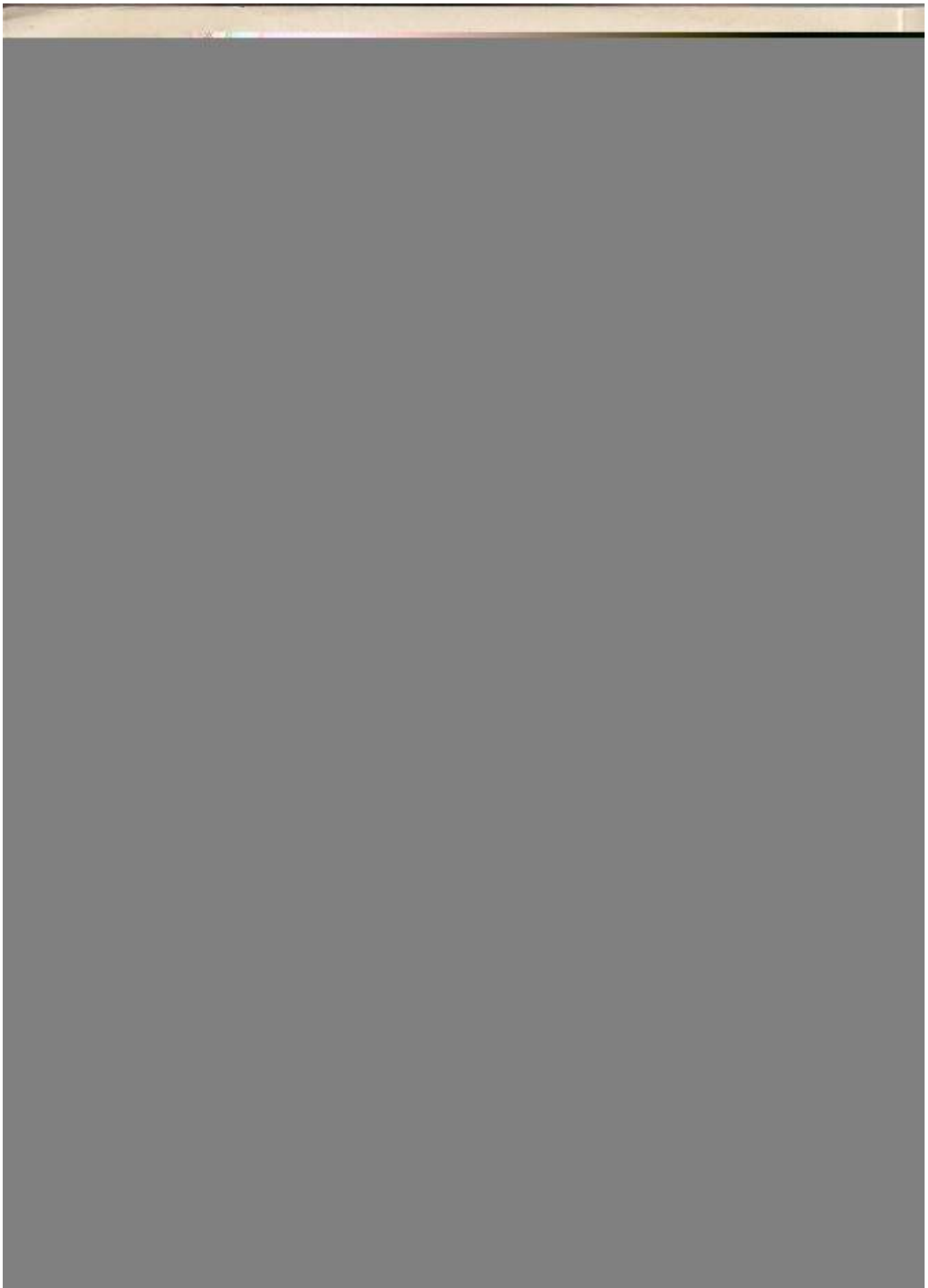
To the Inhabitants of the Town of Washington qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town house in said town on Tuesday, the 12th day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers, Agents and Committees for the year ensuing.
2. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to defray town charges for the year ensuing.
3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to repair highways and bridges for the year ensuing.
4. To see if the town will vote to raise the amount required by the state for the aid of permanent highways for the year ensuing.
5. To see if the town will vote to accept the bequest of the late Hannah B. Chase, whereby she bequeathed to the town seventy-five dollars, the income of the same to be used by said town in the care and maintenance of the Stephen Chase burial lot at East Washington.
6. To see if the town will vote to raise anything for the observance of Memorial Day for the ensuing year.
7. To see if the town will appropriate anything for the observance of Old Home Day for the ensuing year.
8. To see if the town will vote to increase the compensation for labor on the highways.
9. To see if the town will take any action in regard to a water supply for the Centre village.
10. To see if the town will vote to purchase a set of double runners for the hearse at the center of the town.
11. To transact any other business legally coming before said meeting.
