STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Washington, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House, in said town, on Tuesday, the 10th day of March, next, at 10 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- To choose all necessary Town Officers, Agents and Committees for the year ensuing.
- To see what method the town will adopt for the repair and maintenance of highways for the year ensuing.
- To see what sum the town will vote to raise to repair highways and bridges for the year ensuing.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to increase the compensation for labor on the highways, and fix a price for the same.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and set apart the amount required by the State for the building of permanent highways for the year ensuing.
- To see what sum the town will vote to raise to defray town charges for the year ensuing.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to accept a gift of one hundred dollars from the estate of Julia A. N. Tandy, late of Goshen, using the interest only for the care and necessary repairs on burial lot of Benjamin Nichols, in cemetery at East Washington.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to accept a gift of two hundred dollars from Abbie M. Woodbury, the interest of which is to be expended yearly in keeping in perpetual repair the lot of Mary A. Harndon, in East Washington cemetery.

To see what action the town will vote to take in regard to the trust funds now remaining in the town treasury.

ro. To see what action the town will take in regard to buying a new cemetery or enlarging the old one at East Washington, and appropriating money for the same.

11. To see if the town will vote to purchase some kind of an apparatus to extinguish fires for the two villages, and appropriate money for the same.

12. To transact any other business legally coming come before said meeting.
