STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Washington, in the County of Sullivan, in said State Qualified to Vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town house in said Washington on Tuesday the thirteenth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

ART. I. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

ART. II. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.

ART. III. To see what method the town will adopt for the repairs and maintenance of highways and bridges, and what price to pay for labor for the ensuing year.

ART. IV. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repairs of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

ART. V. To see if the town will vote to raise and set apart the amount required by the state for the building of permanent highways for the ensuing year.

ART. VI. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of two hundred dollars to meet a like appropriation from the state for repairs of state highways for the ensuing year.

ART. VII. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money not to exceed one hundred fifty dollars (\$150) to widen the road near Half Moon pond.

ART. VIII. To see if the town will vote to appropriate anything for the observance of Memorial Day, and appoint an agent to take charge of the exercises and expend the money.

ART. IX. To see if the town will accept a legacy from the estate of the late Roxanna Atwood, the interest of which shall be used for support of the public schools in said town.

ART. X. To see if the town will vote to discharge the obligation contained in deed given the present owner of the Lovell House.

ART. XI. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the road between the Dushan buildings and the Thissell buildings.

ART. XII. To see if the town will vote to remove the wall on the west side of the road adjoining land of Charles Trow on road leading from town house to Faxon Hill, and replace it with a suitable wire fence, and make appropriation for expense of the same.

ART. XIII. To transact any other business legally coming before said meeting.
