*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Washington in the County
of Sullivan qualified to vote in Town Affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the town house in said town on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

ARTICLE I. To choose all necessary town officers, agents and trustees.

ART. II. To raise such sums of money as are necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

ART. III. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the repairs of highways and bridges.

ART. IV. To see if the town will vote to raise and set apart the amount required by the state for the building of permanent highways for the ensuing year.

ART. V. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum to meet a like appropriation from the state for the repair of state highways for the ensuing year.

ART. VI. To see if the town will vote to appropriate anything for the observance of Memorial Day the ensuing year and appoint an agent to spend the money.

ART. VII. To see if the town will vote to release the claim on the E. G. Woodward real estate in East Washington Village.

ART. VIII. To see if the town will vote to make the needed repairs and improvements on the Shedd Free Library and appropriate money for the same.

ART. IX. To transact any other business legally coming before this meeting.
