#### TOWN WARRANT.

#### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Washington, qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the town house in said town, on Tuesday, the 14th day of March, next, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers, Agents and Committees for the ensuing year.

- To see what method the town will adopt for the repairs and maintainance of highways for the ensuing year.
- 3. To see what sum the town will vote to raise for the repair of highways and bridges the ensuing year.
- 4. To see what price the town will vote to pay for labor on highways the ensuing year.
- To see if the town will vote to raise and set apart the amount required by the State for the building of permanent highways the ensuing year.
- 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to defray town charges the ensuing year.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to accept the sum of one hundred dollars from Mrs. Georgiana C. Dinsmore of Keene, N. H., in trust, the same to be safely invested and the income only to be used in the perpetual care of the O. S. Carey cemetery lot in the Washington Center cemetery.
- To see if the town will vote to raise a sum, not to exceed twenty-five dollars, to aid in purchasing iron markers for the graves of its soldiers.

- 9. To see if the town will vote to extend the new road built last year across land of E. G. Farnsworth, W. W. Dole, Faulkner & Colony and W. H. Howe to highway between Wilcox mill and the Stephen Farnsworth place, and invest of the trust funds now invested outside of the town interests, a sum not to exceed two thousand dollars for building of said road.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to raise anything for the purchase of fire apparatus the ensuing year.
- To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
