TOWN WARRANT.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Washington, qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said town on Tuesday, the 11th day of March, next, at 10 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects :

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers, Agents and Committees for the ensuing year.

2. To see what method the town will adopt for the repairs and maintenance of highways for the ensuing year.

3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repairs of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

4. To see if the town will vote to raise and set apart the amount required by the State for the building of permanent highways for the ensuing year.

5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

6. To see if the town will vote to observe Old Home Day, and make an appropriation therefor.

7. To see if the town will vote to appropriate anything for the observance of Memorial Day the ensuing year.

8. To see if the town will vote to appoint or elect an agent in each part of the town to look after its cemeteries, and report to the town annually of the receipts and expenditures.

9. To see if the town will vote to accept the sum of fifty dollars from the estate of the late Greeley Putney, and perpetually care for the Putney lot in the Centre cemetery.

10. To see what sum of money the town will raise to repair town buildings the ensuing year.

11. To see if the town will vote to take any action in regard to better fire protection and appropriate money for the same.

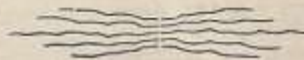
12. To see what action the town will vote to take in regard to insurance and repairs on the Lovell House the ensuing year, or pass any vote relating thereto.

13. To transact any other business legally coming before said meeting.

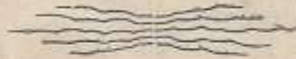
