TOWN WARRANT.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Washington, in the County of Sullivan, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Washington, on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

ART. 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year, including three trustees for the Trust Funds.

ART. 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.

ART. 3. To see what method the town will adopt for the repairs and maintenance of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

ART. 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repairs of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

ART. 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and set apart the amount required by the State for the building of permanent highways for the ensuing year.

ART. 6. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred dollars to meet an appropriation of one hundred and twenty-five dollars from the State for the repairs of State highways, for the ensuing year.

ART. 7. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred dollars to repair the road from the East Washington road to Island Pond.

- ART. 8. To see if the town will vote to appropriate anything for the observance of Memorial Day, and appoint an agent to take charge of the exercises and expend the money.
- ART. 9. To see if the town will choose a Library Committee in the following manner: One to be elected for one year, one for two years, and one for three years, and thereafter one to be elected annually for three years.
- ART. 10. To see if the town will choose an agent to take charge of the Town Histories, who shall be authorized to make such reductions in price as he shall deem advisable according to condition of books sold. Said agent shall hold this position until his successor shall be chosen, and shall annually make a report of the number sold and the number on hand.
- ART. 11. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the purpose of re-cataloging the books in Shedd Free Library, and appoint an agent to have charge of same.
- ART. 12. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the road beginning at the Charles Carley place on Goshen road and extending to Lempster line; also road between Thissell buildings and Dushan buildings.
- ART. 13. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the road beginning at the Amory Wright corner and extending about one and one-half miles to the Abbott corner, near the Ellis Copeland farm; also road beginning at James Farnsworth place and extending about two and one-half miles to Marlow line; and build in place thereof a new road by extending the new Millen Pond road across land of E. G. Farnsworth, W. W. Dole, and along the north shore of Ashuelot Pond, to the road leading to Marlow near Wilcox Mill; and provide some method for raising money for the expense of the same, not to exceed three thousand dollars.

ART. 14. To transact any other business legally coming before said meeting.
