TOWN WARRANT.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Washington, in the County of Sullivan, qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said town on Tuesday, the 12th day of March, next, at 10 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To choose one delegate to the Constitutional Convention, to be held in Concord, on June next.

Article 3. To raise such sums of money, as are necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

Article 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repair of Highways and Bridges for the ensuing year.

Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and set apart the amount required by the State for the building of permanent highways for the ensuing year.

Article 6. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of (Two Hundred Dollars,) to meet a like appropriation from the State for the repair of State highways for the ensuing year.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to appropriate any thing for the observance of Memorial Day the ensuing year and appoint an Agent to spend the money.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the highway from the Dushan building, to the Thissell building

Article 9. To transact any other business legally coming before said meeting.
