TOWN WARRANT.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Washington, qualified to vote in town affairs. You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town, on Tuesday, March 9, 1926 at 10:00 A. M. to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To elect a Town Clerk, Treasurer, one Selectman for three years, Road Agents, Auditor, Member of Trust Funds Committee for three years, Tax Collector, Library Committee, one member for one year, one member for two years, one member for three years, and all other necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the repair of its highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Article 3. To see if the Town will raise and set apart the amount required by the State for the building of permanent highways for the ensuing year.

Article 4. To see if the Town will raise and contribute a sum equal to that given by the State for the maintenance of the State highways for the ensuing year.

Article 5. To see what sum of money the Town will raise to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year.

Article 6. To see what sum the Town will appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day this year.

Article 7. To see what sum the Town will appropriate for the support of the Shedd Free Library.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to observe the 150th anniversary of its settlement by a celebration in Old Home Week and appropriate money for same.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to accept a legacy from the estate of A. H. Jaquith, subject to the conditions of the bequest.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise anything for a Publicity Fund, and appoint a committee to act in conjunction with the Hillsboro Committee in advertising the various attractions in this section.

Article 11. To transact any other business legally coming before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board of Washington, N. H.

The report of the Superintendent of Schools, for the year 1924-1925 is hereby submitted:

We started in this year with an entirely new corps of teachers. Miss Eva Williams who gave excellent service at the East Washington School, left for a higher salary in another New Hampshire town, and Miss Jane Otterson was chosen teacher of that school. Miss Otterson belongs to a Washington family, and has taken a short summer course at the Keene Normal School. Miss Esther Watts replaced Miss Shedd at the Center. It is interesting to note that Miss Watts' mother taught in this school some years ago. Mrs. Wheeler, a teacher of about four years experience came to the Dole School. All these teachers have been satisfactory and have been re-engaged for the coming year. The Dole School commenced on Sept. 15, a week later than the others as extensive repairs were being made during the summer and the school building was not ready for occupancy until the date mentioned. This little school has been remodeled on up to date lines as is a source of pride to the neighborhood.

Forty-two pupils were registered this year, 24 boys and 18 girls. Eight of these moved into town during the school year and two were tuition pupils. Following is the grade distribution for the past two years:

The total salary paid the teachers was \$1,908, slightly less than the \$1,980 paid the previous year. The salaries are low and I believe the people are willing to spend more money for this purpose, and they have planned to do so for the coming year. The attendance was not as good as last year, although because of the remarkably good record at the Dole School the average for the whole town was fair.

It is seldom that a school has as high a percentage of attendance as 99, and we gladly credit parents, teachers, and pupils of the Dole School for their excellent record, and I believe the incentive of an almost new building may have had something to do with the condition. For two whole years this school has not had a case of tardiness. I wonder if any school in the state can equal that record. No other school in this Union equalled it.

There were no pupils on the Honor Roll in 1920-1, and according to the above record Alice Crane has been

neither absent or tardy for four years. We are glad to give that fact special mention, and to especially commend Alice.

The results of this year's Standard tests showed our schools to be up to the average, and we had planned to let the parents see some of the results of the school work at regular graduation exercises, but because of an epidemic we were obliged to give up the exercises, and simply hand out the diplomas. We hope, however, to have these exercises regularly hereafter.

The school board made six visits, and the superintendent 53, an average of one to each teacher every two weeks, besides attending 12 school board meetings.

There were 189 visits by parents and others, compared with 103 last year.
