 To the Inhabitants of the Town of Washington, Qualified
 to Vote in Town Affairs:
- You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town, on Tuesday the 11th day of March next, at 10 of the clock, in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects.
- To elect a Town Clerk, Treasurer, one Selectman for three years, Road Agents, Auditor, Member of Trust Funds Committee for three years, and all other necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the repair of its Highways and Bridges for the ensuing year.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and set apart the amount required by the State for the building of permanent Highways for the ensuing year.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and contribute a sum equal to that given by the State for the maintenance of State Highways for the ensuing year.
- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to defray Town charges for the ensuing year.
- To see if the Town will appropriate anything for the observance of Memorial Day the ensuing year.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to accept the legacy from the estate of the late Oscar Hartwell and perpetually care for his lot in the Center Cemetery.

- 9. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) from Esther H. French. The interest to be used to keep in good condition the burial lots of the French and Storey families and their monuments thereon in the new Center Cemetery.
- 10. To see what action the Town will take in regard to renting of the Town Hall and securing a Janitor for the same.
- To see if the Town will vote to paint and repair the Town Hall and appropriate money for the same.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to replace the Red Bridge, so called, with a modern cement bridge, the State to furnish a certain per cent of the funds for the building of the same.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the following highways. The road leading from the building of Auren Powers to the Bradford line. The road connecting the Mellin Pond road with the Marlow road. The South Stoddard road, beginning at the Long Pond road to the Stoddard line. The road from Lakeside Cottage, so called, to Ashuelot Pond. The road beginning at the Wright corner on the Stoddard and Marlow road, via the Abbott place to the Stoddard line.
- To see what action the Town will take regarding the Hotel Committee report.
- To see what bonds the Town will require of the Trust Funds Committee.
- To see what action the Town will take in regard to changing the location of the Buffum Hill road.
- To see if the Town will vote to purchase a furnace for the Library or pass any vote relating thereto.

- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise money to eradicate the White Pine Blister which has been reported in this locality.
- 19. To see if the Town will appoint a committee to investigate the feasibility of establishing a Town Forest and make recommendations at the regular Town Meeting in March, 1925.
- 20. To bring in your votes for the election of Delegatesat-large, Alternate Delegates-at-large, District Delegates, Alternate District Delegates to the National Conventions of the Democratic and Republican parties, to be held for the purpose of nominating party candidates for President and Vice-President of the United States. fore said meeting.
- 21. To transact any other business legally coming before said meeting.

To the School Board of Washington:

The report of the Superintendent of schools for the year 1922-1923, is herewith respectfully submitted.

There was no change in the location or number of the schools this year. Much to our regret Miss Vina Dole decided to resign and accept a position under the same Superintendent in Hillsboro. Mr. Philip Marcey was an excellent teacher at the Center last year, but he was not certified by the State Department of Education because he had not attended Normal School and did not care to agree to attend it in the future. Without such certification a person cannot teach, so we were obliged to look elsewhere for a teacher. Miss Eliza Getchell felt unable to teach the Dole School another year, and we were left with the task of finding teachers for all our schools.

Miss Tuttle preferred to return to the Dole School after being away for two years, and was elected teacher of that school. No one was found to teach the other schools until almost time for schools to open in the fall. Some candidates did not care to locate so far from the Railroad, and others would not accept the salary we have been in the habit of paying, although it is very likely that if a satisfactory teacher could have been found who would have come to us at a higher salary, a higher salary might have been obtained.

Four young people came to the Superintendent from the Keene Normal School after having attended one summer session. Two of them preferred to go to Deering, and the other two to Washington. It happened that the two teachers who went to Deering were among the very best teachers, while the two who came to Washington did not suit our needs as well. Mr. Walter J. Gale, who came to the Center School, resigned at Christmas time, and was succeeded by Miss Elmar Shedd. Miss Lorange Trembley, who taught at East Washington, was not a candidate for re-election.

There were 46 pupils in our schools this year, less than in the previous years. This was largely due to the removal of practically all the lumber mill families, from the town. Of these 46, the girls numbered 21, and the boys 25.

The Dole School had the best attendance and the only child who was neither absent or late for the whole year. It should be noted to her credit that she was thus regular in attendance in spite of a most severe winter, and of her youthfulness, as she was only seven years old. It is certain that the teacher has great influence over the attendance of her pupils. If she feels that regularity in attendance is an important matter, they also feel the same, and vice versa; though, of course, that is not the only factor, and no teacher could be blamed for non-attendance due to illness or to the fault of the parent. The attendance was very good considering the severity of the winter. Last year, under Miss Dole the attendance was the best in the town, 93.5 per cent, while this year under another teacher it was the lowest in the town, 88 per cent. Last year the Dole School attendance, 88.5 per cent, was the lowest in the town; while this year, under Miss Tuttle, it was the highest in the town, 93 per cent. There were 174 days of school at the Center, 172 at the Dole School, and 171 at East Washington, an average of about 7 days lost during the entire year, for holidays, institutes, illness and bad weather. A very good record.

There were only 27 cases of tardiness for the 46 children. Two were at the Center, and 7 at the Dole School, which were excellent records. If the record for the East School had been as good we would have had a wonderful attendance record, but there were 18 cases of tardiness in that school, just twice as many as in both the other schools.

The Superintendent paid 40 visits of supervision and inspection and attended 12 Board meetings, the school Board made 12 visits, and there were recorded 104 visits by parents and friends. Both the superintendent and the Committee made more visits than they did in the previous year, but the record of parent's and friends' visits for the past three years has been: 1920-21, 173 visits; 1921-22, 196 visits; 1922-23 only 104 visits.

Parents and friends have a standing invitation to visit the schools at any time, without special invitation. Such visits encourage the pupils and the teacher.
