TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Washington, in the County of Sullivan, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the Town Hall in said Washington on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- Article 1. To elect a Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, one Selectman for three years, Road Agent, Tax Collector, Auditor, Fire Chief, one member of Trust Fund Committee for three years, one member of Library Committee for three years and any other necessary town officers.
- Article 2. To see if the town will vote to adjust the salaries of any town officers.
- Article 3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repair of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
- Article 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$705.00 to accept State Aid of \$1,410.00 for the construction of S. A. C. highway in said town.
- Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$484.05 and accept State Aid of \$1,936.20 for Town Road Aid in said town.
- Article 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray town charges for the ensuing year.
- Article 7. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- Article 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of Shedd Free Library, for the ensuing year.

- Article 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Fire Department.
- Article 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750.00 to complete payment on the note due December 10, 1949, borrowed for the purchase of truck and plow.
- Article 11. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to be transferred to Capital Reserve for construction of a town garage.
- Article 12. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money, to be transferred to Capital Reserve for the purchase of highway equipment, or take any action relating thereto.
- Article 13. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to be transferred to Capital Reserve for the town hall water supply, or take any action relating thereto.
- Article 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the control of blister rust.
- Article 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region Association.
- Article 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for band concerts.
- Article 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to paint the town hall or take any action relating thereto.
- Article 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to repair the dam at the East Washington mill pond or take any action relating thereto.
- Article 19. To see what action the town will take in regard to the Town of Washington Scrap Fund.
- Article 20. To see if the town will vote to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting.

Article 21. To see if the town will vote to request the State Tax Commission to make a complete reappraisal of the lands and buildings within the town, to equalize valuations in accordance with the law, and raise and appropriate a sum of money to cover the cost of same.

Article 22. To see if the town will elect a permanent planning committee or take any action relating thereto.

Article 23. To see if the town will elect a committee to improve the common, raise and appropriate a sum of money for the same or take any action relating thereto.

Article 24. To see if the town will raise and appropriate a sum of money to construct a road from the Y. M. C. A. ball field to the old Marlow road or take any action relating thereto.

Article 25. To see if the town will vote to accept the sum of \$50.00 from Mrs. Julia F. Nichols, the same to be added to the Belle C. Ball Trust Fund, for the perpetual care of the Belle C. Ball lot in the new cemetery.

Article 26. To see if the town will vote to observe, during the month of August, 1949, the 50th Anniversary of Old Home Week, and raise and appropriate a sum of money therefor, or take any action relating thereto.

Article 27. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

- 10. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to install a water supply, flush toilets, bubbler, and sinks, in the Washington Center School, with necessary sewage disposal system and incidental building alterations deemed necessary to properly complete the same.

- 11. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to withdraw to its use all the funds on deposit in the capital reserve fund of the district, to be used for the purpose of partially financing the cost of carrying out the vote of the district under articles 9 and 10 of this warrant.
- 12. To see if the district will raise and appropriate one thousand dollars for the use of the school board in carrying out the vote of the district under articles 9 and 10 of this warrant, or to take any action thereon.
- 13. To see if the district will raise and appropriate twelve hundred dollars to further carry out the installations and alterations as voted by the district under articles 9 and 10 of this warrant, and in order to furnish such funds to authorize the school board to borrow this amount for two years on the credit of the district and to delegate to the school board authority to fix the time and place of payment of the principal and interest.

REPORT OF SCHOOL ADMINISTRATION

To the School Board and Citizens of Washington:

I present this, my fourth annual report concerning the Washington School, with considerable pride in the educational progress which has been accomplished in your school through the combined efforts of the parents and school board during the past three years. There is still much to be done.

As Dr. James B. Conant, president of Harvard University, has recently ably pointed out, the cultural pattern of our society will be largely determined by the nature of our education. Our educational system reflects the social structure of this free and fluid nation. Our free tax-supported schools are the sinews of our society; they are the product of our special history, a concrete manifestation of our ideals, and the instrument by which the "American" concept of democracy may be transmitted to our future citizens. It is perhaps not too much to say that the strength of this republic is intimately connected with the success or failure of our system of public education.

We must realize then, that our vast system of public schools is both the embodiment of the unique features of our idealism and the vehicle for the transmission of our idea of a free democracy to subsequent generations.

Many of our schools have for long, taught what youngsters they could, how to count and read and recite, with little or no attention to the bigger problem of education which was to help them improve their thinking. With this lack of thinking in education our pupils grew into manhood or womanhood little realizing their handicaps. And in their time we came to have more unproductive areas with small industries and farms closed down. Gradually these areas became worse off economically and as they did, their educational budgets had to be retrenched. The schools have failed miserably to train their pupils for the responsibilities of present day society.

However, it is not too late in most schools. Here in Washington, Miss Hoyt has had considerable success with her school in using the better type of social studies teaching methods which Dr. Bruce and Dr. Lewis of the State Department of Education have been working all over our state to introduce as a first essential to an inspired comeback in our educational lag. We are handicapped by a lack of visual aids materials but we are encouraged by the sympathetic interest of the parents, and we also have plans to purchase needed equipment gradually. We have to introduce our pupils to the outside world in a great measure through these visual materials such as maps, charts, films, film strips, recordings, and reference libraries. All these things cost the taxpayers money but their inclusion in our program is necessary if we are to bring our pupils up to date and send them into adulthood with a background of which we can have any hope will provide them with a zeal to do something about prosperity in these areas. Too long we have taught them to read and write and then go to the city. A life of abundance may be available near home, if our schools did a half decent job of preparing them for it.

The splendid work of Miss Hoyt has been well received in the community. We were unable to keep Mr. Hill as the music teacher since he returned to the University of New Hampshire for further study. Mr. Kenneth Jewett was engaged to serve in Mr. Hill's place and he has been very helpful in promoting a fine arts program in the school. It has been difficult to secure Art and Music Supervisors with the meager funds at our disposal so we are indeed fortunate to secure the services of such a well-prepared teacher as Mr. Jewett, who does both. Mrs. Griffin has continued her work as health supervisor and besides the classroom visitation, has done considerable clinic service where needed.

As voted by the district, the Dole school property was sold by the school board during the summer. The proceeds of the sale are now invested with the Trustees of Trust Funds according to law, to the credit of the district capital reserve fund. I hope that it will be possible to modernize the school plant soon and this

will serve as a nucleus of the needed funds. Since this report must go to the printer so early in order to get the reports back in time for the meeting, it is planned to issue a special mimeographed report to the annual meeting on a modernization program.

In our budget we have had to provide for the insurance policies which are all due this year. We shall however arrange to have the new policies written so that they will expire in amounts of one-third each year so that from now on the insurance will be the same each year instead of all every third year. This is the usual procedure in many communities.

There is a bill in the legislature to make high school transportation compulsory. If the bill becomes a law, your board will have to take steps to carry it out next summer.

For next year, we anticipate that we will have six pupils in high school and sixteen in the Center school. We have estimated that high school tuition will be \$160 per pupil but it may be more.

I greatly appreciate the fine co-operation during the year from the parents and pupils, the splendid work of Miss Hoyt, and the keen, active participation and planning in the co-operative management of the school by members of your school board; Preston E. Rolfe, Dr. Lura Bruce and Norman Fletcher. It is a pleasure and an honor to be a part of such teamwork in the interests of the pupils of Washington.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN

Your local organization to prevent and extinguish brush and woods fires is glad to report a good year of forest protection in 1948. In spite of danger conditions nearly equalling at times those of 1947 when great losses were suffered in New Hampshire and New England, fire damage and loss this year have been gratifyingly low.

With the continuing co-operation of all the people, we can hope to have another successful year in 1949. Let us remember that in any year, over 90 per cent of all fires are caused by carelessness and that all of these

man-caused fires are preventable.

Today, we have more slash and uncut grassland than for many years in the past. Smokers, campers and tourists who use our outdoors are also more numerous than ever before. We must therefore be ready for fires which might occur but, above all, prevention by everyone is the greatest need.

A few simple precautions taken by every citizen will

help, as follows:

 Always get a written permit from the warden before kindling a fire outdoors when the ground is not covered with snow.

(2) If you smoke, always extinguish matches and tobacco before dropping or throwing them down. In autmobiles, always use the ash trays.

(3) Report fires and smokes to the warden without

delay.

The observance of these and other simple rules will go far to insure safety from fire damage and your cooperation in this way is earnestly solicited.
