



THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE  
**TOWN WARRANT**

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To the Inhabitants of the Town of Washington, in the County of Sullivan, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Washington on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To elect a TOWN CLERK, TOWN TREASURER, one SELECTMAN for three years, ROAD AGENT, TAX COLLECTOR, AUDITOR, FIRE CHIEF, one member of the TRUST FUND committee for three years, one member of the LIBRARY committee for three years, one member of the PLANNING committee for five years, and other necessary town officers,

2. To see if the Town will vote to introduce an Act in the Legislature to reclassify to Class V the Lempster Road, in the Town of Washington, from its junction with Route 31 in Washington Village to the Lempster Town line and that such sums as may have been apportioned by the State together with the Capital Reserve for S. A. C. in the Town of Washington account, for the construction of above named road as a secondary highway be used in whichever of the following choices the Town votes to accept:

a. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or authorize the Selectmen to borrow on term notes the sum of \$3,000.00 and accept State Aid of \$15,000.00 which together with the joint sums of S. A. C. funds already raised by the Town and matched by the State for said road will be used to build said road from end of present black top to the Lempster line according to Class V standards under the supervision of the Commissioner of Public Works and Highways, and authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the Capital Reserve for S. A. C. when requested by the State. Under this plan the unpaid assessment of \$6,880.00 for secondary highways would be cancelled and the State matching funds withdrawn.

b. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or authorize the Selectmen to borrow on term notes

the unpaid assessment of \$6,880.00 for S. A. C. for which matching funds have already been set aside by the State, which sum together with the S. A. C. funds already set aside by the Town and matched by the State will be used to complete the Lempster road to Class V standards under the supervision of the Commissioner of Public Works and Highways, and authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the Capital Reserve for S. A. C. when requested by the State.

c. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate either of the above two sums and vote to transfer them by an Act of Legislature together with the other sums named above to a State Aid Reconstruction project on Route 31 and authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the Capital Reserve for S. A. C. when requested by the State.

3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$470.22 and accept State Aid of \$3,134.83 for Town Road Aid in said town.

4. To see if the Town will vote to increase the wages of the Highway Department.

5. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a Town truck.

6. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a combination grader or tractor with scraper, and loader and mower attachments.

7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purchase of Highway equipment, and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the Capital Reserve for Highway equipment and to borrow a sufficient amount on term notes to pay the balance.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Charges for the ensuing year.

10. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Shedd Free Library for the ensuing year.

12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Fire Department for the ensuing year.

13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the developing of the new cemetery lands, or take any action relating thereto.

14. To see what action the Town will vote to take in regard to the Cemetery Committee.

15. To see if the Town will vote to name the turn-around in the New Center cemetery the John M. Safford Lane.

16. To see what action the Town will take in regard to purchasing any new cemetery land in East Washington and raise and appropriate a sum of money for the same.

17. To hear the reports on the plans and costs of a town garage.

18. To see if the Town will vote to build a town garage, or take any action relating thereto.

19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the Capital Reserve for town garage and to borrow a sufficient sum on long term notes to pay the balance.

20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region.

21. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for band concerts.

22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be transferred to Capital Reserve for the purchase of Highway equipment or take any action relating thereto.

23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be transferred to Capital Reserve for the construction of a Town garage, or take any action relating thereto.

24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be transferred to Capital Reserve for the construction of permanent bridges or take any action relating thereto.

25. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to dispose of the Caterpillar tractor, snowplow, loader and road machine or any of them and apply the proceeds on the purchase of any new highway equipment voted to purchase today.

26. To see if the Town will vote to repair the present Town garage and raise and appropriate a sum of money for the same.

27. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

## SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

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To the School Board and Citizens of Washington:

The enrollment at the Washington Central School increased from an average daily membership in 1955-56 of 20.3 to 33 at the opening of school this fall. Since then it has been reduced to 28 which appears to be the constant figure for the year. Registration as of this writing is as follows:

Grade 1-2	Grade 5-3
2-3	6-4
3-2	7-3
4-6	8-5

For several years now Washington has been fortunate in the amount it has been required to pay for high school tuition. For the school year 1957-58 it appears that there will be a decided increase in the number of pupils attending high school from Washington and this will be reflected in this year's budget. That number can now be expected to increase for at least three years more.

The per pupil cost for Washington Central School pupils for 1955-56 was \$334.72. This is a very modest figure when comparing it with similar schools in the state.

The noon lunch program under the very able management of Mrs. Elsie Fletcher and Mrs. Dora Newman continues to be one of the many bright spots in this school. The community spirit which prevails in working for the success of this program is wonderful to see.

New arithmetic books have been purchased for every grade this year and it is planned to change another outdated set next year. Your board should be complimented for handling this problem in this way—because it saves a large expenditure in any one year.

Again, I am happy to have the opportunity to express my appreciation to the School Board, the teachers, citizens and pupils of Washington for their fine cooperation during the school year.
