#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

#### TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Washington, in the County of Sullivan, in said State, qualified to vote on Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Washington on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Art. 1. To elect a Town Clerk, Town Treasurer. one Selectman for three years, Road Agent, Tax Collector, Auditor, Fire Chief, Police Chief, one member of the Trust Fund committee for three years, one member of the Library committee for three years, one member of the Planning Committee for five years, and other necessary town officers.

Art. 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$583.29 and accept State Aid

of \$3,888.59 for Town Road Aid in said Town.

Art. 3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Art. 4. To see if the Town will vote to use a portion of the 1960 Town Road Aid money to pay for

the October flood damage.

Art. 5. To see if the Town will vote to install a street light at Bradford Road corner in East Washington.

Art. 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Charges for the ensuing year.

Art. 7. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Art. 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Shedd Free Library for the ensuing year.

Art. 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the

Fire Department for the ensuing year.

Art. 10. To see what sum of money the Town will

vote to raise and appropriate to pay on long term

garage notes, \$1,000.00 of which is due.

Art. 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$60.00 for the support of the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region for 1960.

Art. 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for band concerts.

Art. 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be transferred to Capital Reserve for Permanent Bridges.

Art. 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to purchase a Tractor Loader.

Art. 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be transferred to Capi-

tal Reserve for Highway Equipment.

Art. 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be transferred to Capital Reserve for tarring T. R. A. roads already completed, and vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw same whenever necessary.

Art. 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for improvement of the Beach at pond in East Washington. (By Petition)

Art. 18. To see if the Town will vote to rescind the vote under Article 12 of the Warrant of 1957, concerning wire fence around the Maynard section of the East Washington Cemetery and vote to relocate the present stone wall.

Art. 19. To see if the Town will vote to adopt an Ordinance relating to building permits as follows:

Section 1. No person, firm, or corporation shall erect any new building or structure or alter, change, improve, or make any additions to an existing building or structure, or cause the same to be done within the Town of Washington, which shall be in excess of one hundred dollars without first obtaining a permit from the Town Clerk. Fee for said permit shall be \$1.00.

Section 2. Any person, firm, or corporation violating the provision of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of one dollar and each days neglect to obtain such a permit shall constitute a separate offense.

Art. 20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to have the Inventory published in the Town Report of March 1961.

Art. 21. To see what action the Town will take in regards to wages of Town Officers and Employees and

pass any vote relating thereto.

Art. 22. To see what action the Town will take in regards to bringing Town History up to date, and

raise and appropriate a sum of money for same.

Art. 23. To see if the Town will vote to lay out a road below the Perley Crane farm buildings to eliminate Town road through the yard, to negotiate with A. J. Bowron, developer of Highland Lake, in regard to sharing the expense and to raise and appropriate a sum of money for same or take any other action relating thereto.

Art. 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to paint any part of the interior of the Town hall or take any other action re-

lating thereto.

Art. 25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to purchase an addressograph machine for the use of the Selectmen, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, or take action relating thereto.

Art. 26. To see what action the Town wishes to take with respect to the plowing of private driveways.

Art. 27. To transact any other business that may

legally come before said meeting.

#### PREVENTION IS EVERYBODY'S BUSINESS

The year 1959 was fortunate from a forest fire standpoint. New Hampshire had the best record in the nation. Fewer acres were burned, suppression costs were substantially reduced and damage to woodlands held to a minimum. The record resulted from a combination of favorable weather conditions, an alert warden service and a cooperating public.

Yet, despite all this, there still persists a disturbing note.

58%, or 6 out of every 10 fires in 1959 were caused by careless smokers and debris burners.

10%, or 1 out of every 9 fires were caused by children.

Careless, indifferent, thoughtless and independent minded individuals and failure of parents to properly supervise children and keep matches out of their reach, annually cause these unnecessary fire which cost large sums to extinguish and cause extensive damage. The elimination of these three causes of fires would radically change this picture. The rules are simple —

- Before burning, secure a permit from your local forest fire warden—the law requires it.
- 2. Be sure to properly supervise your burning.
- Make certain your fire is DEAD OUT before leaving it.
- Don't throw lighted matches, cigars and cigarettes from moving vehicles—use your ash tray.
- Don't burn at home—Use your town dump and save yourself much possible difficulty, both personal and financial.

To the School Board and Citizens of Washington:

I am pleased to present my sixth annual report for your consideration.

During the school year 1958-59, Mrs. Madeleine Basto found it necessary to resign due to illness. We were fortunate to obtain the services of Mrs. Norman Fletcher and Mrs. John Tasker to complete the year. Fortunately, Mrs. Basto fully regained her health and was able to return to us this year.

School opened with 19 pupils which has since increased to 21. Grade divisions are as follows:

Tuition at Hillsboro during the present year is \$350 and at Newport \$350. The State average cost per high school pupil, which is the basis for most tuition charges, is \$388.

Kathryn Otterson should be congratulated for consistently having her name on the honor roll.

In 1955-56 Washington paid \$919.49 for tuition for three high school pupils. Next year it is anticipated that there will be 15 tuition pupils which will make our tuition payment \$5,040. Taking this into consideration, it is not difficult to understand why the total budget continues to grow. It appears that the above number of tuition pupils should remain rather constant from now on, and that the total budget will not suffer more large increases.

Transportation costs have fluctuated the past few years due to changing routes. Inasmuch as it is not now necessary to make the East Washington trip, the present cost is at its lowest peak.

Mrs. Babb and Mrs. Newman continue to do well with the noon lunch program. The amount of surplus commodities is small and although several different items have been received the total amount is not great. Mrs. O'Keefe has contributed greatly to the program by transporting the milk daily.

Mrs. Mary Griffin, R. N., continues to watch over the school health problems with a personal interest in each youngster. We are fortunate to be able to continue her services.

It has again been a pleasure to work with the pupils, teacher, School Board and citizens of Washington and I wish to express my appreciation for their fine cooperation.
