This expanded program, obviously, is more expensive to operate, but without doubt, our youngsters will be more effectively prepared for their secondary training.

With six graduating this year from high school and three from the Central School, tuition costs are certain to be reduced, although tuition rates are expected to advance to \$414.

You have probably read with some concern a proposal made by the Chairman of the State Board of Education relative to the reduction of school districts in New Hampshire. Consistent with my thinking, relative to Cooperative school districts, the proposal has merit. However, there are a great many problems to be worked out prior to the implementation of such a program, and New Hampshire will "make haste slowly" in its adoption.

I cannot conceive of such a program becoming operative in the near future, but I believe that it behooves small districts such as Washington to think in terms of what the adoption of such a program will mean to them. A few plans formulated now could be of great help in determining the direction Washington wishes to go, when and if the State proposal becomes effective. Until that time, I repeat, Washington should determine her own destiny in terms of what the citizens feel is best for the children of that community.

The Noon Lunch program under the guidance of Mrs. Babb and Mrs. Newman continues to be a bright spot in the school. High praise for the districts effort was given by State and Federal Directors when they visited us in the Fall. All associated with the program wish to extend our sincere gratitude to Mr. Gilbert Williams for his services making it possible for us to continue the milk program.

Although our problems this year have been larger than usual, it has been gratifying to see them work out, and I wish to express my appreciation to the School Board, teachers, pupils and citizens for their cooperation.
