# THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Washington, in the County of Sullivan, in said State, qualified to vote on Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Washington on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March, next at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- Art. 1. To elect a Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, one Selectman for three years, Road Agent, Tax Collector, Auditor, Fire Chief, Police Chief, one member of the Library Committee for three years, and other necessary Town officers.
- Art. 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$574.52 and accept State Aid of \$3,830.14 for Town Road Aid in said Town.
- Art. 3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of high-ways and bridges for the ensuing year.
- Art. 4. To hear the report of the Town History Committee and to see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the use of the committee.
- Art. 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Charges for the ensuing year.
- Art. 6. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- Art. 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Shedd Free Library for the ensuing year.
  - Art. 8. To see what sum of money the Town will

vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Fire Department for the ensuing year.

- Art. 9 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay on long term garage notes, \$1,000.00 of which is due.
- Art. 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region for 1963.
- Art. 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Band Concerts.
- Art. 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, and transfer to Capital Reserve, for Permanent Bridges.
- Art. 13 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be transferred to Capital Reserve for Highway Equipment.
- Art. 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to improve the new cemetery land in Washington Center.
- Art. 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be transferred to Capital Reserve for Fire Equipment.
- Art. 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 to improve the Public Beach at Millen Pond.
- Art. 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10.00 to have the Natural-Life Christmas tree at the Bandstand, lighted at Christmas time.
- Art. 18. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for playground equipment.
- Art. 19. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum not exceeding \$22,000.00 for the purpose of making improvements to the following Class V Roads within the Town; to complete the T.R.A. project on the East Washington Road, such sum to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 241, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated,

1955, as amended by Laws of 1957, Chapter 273:3, and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interest of the Town of Washington.

Art. 20. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

### Report of Librarian and Trustees

From the 2,758 volumes in the Library and the 3,372 volumes brought by the Bookmobile, 3,995 books and magazines were loaned by the library during 1962.

During 1961 the 4,023 circulation gave the Shedd Free Library the second highest per capita circulation of the 228 libraries in New Hampshire, with an average of 24.8 books taken out by each of our 162 population, more than four times the average of 6.0 books per capita for the whole state. Our library ranked seventh with an average expenditure of \$5.06 per person for library purposes compared to the New Hampshire average of \$1.91 per capita. These figures show we support as well as use our library.

The library is only open one day a week, Wednesday, from 2:30 to 4.30 in the afternoon and 7 to 9 in the evening, but be sure to come to browse or take out books if you haven't done so, as it is your library.

### PREVENTING FOREST FIRES IS OUR RESPONSIBILITY

Costs of suppressing carelessly set outdoor fires in New Hampshire in 1962 cost the persons responsible \$5,545. In the same period, the cost to the cities and town for control of such fires for which no responsibility could be placed cost another \$24,634. What utter waste of tax money and what shameful and needless loss of timber and esthetic values in the 2,200 acres burned. Residences, farms, and other business places were threatened with possible total destruction.

Carelessly set man caused fires can be prevented if every citizen remembers his responsibility in regard to any source of fires in the open. We can help to keep our fire loss low by remembering these simple rules.

- 1. Dispose of burnable waste at the town dump.
  - If waste or brush is to be burned on the premises, obtain a permit from the forest fire warden. Seasonal permits may be issued for approved incinerators and sites.
  - Burn safely by picking a clean site, avoiding dry windy weather and preferably burning late in the day.
  - Have something to keep the fire under control—pails of water, garden hose, sprinkling can, broom for grass fires or shovel will help.
  - 5. Be sure your fire is dead out before you leave it.
  - If the fire gets out of control or if you see a fire out of control, report promptly to your warden or fire department. Continue to fight it until help arrives.

There is potential danger when matches fall into the hands of children. It is never to early for parents to instill in the child's mind a respect for fire.

Some of Washington's citizens attended the hearing conducted by the Interim Commission on Education held May 29, 1962, in Hillsboro. Their first report has been printed and contains some very interesting reading. In the main they confine themselves to discussing the future of secondary education in New Hampshire, but in some instances indicate a need for local school districts to give

serious thought to providing their youngsters with the educational opportunities which may be obtained in a school, "with one grade per teacher per room". They say that out of 217 school districts in the state only 28 have an average daily membership of 1-50. They say that in these schools "one grade per teacher per room is not provided, and the quality of education necessarily suffers" and the cost per pupil is high.

Last year our per pupil cost for our elementary youngsters was \$563.00 per pupil while the cost for the high school youngsters was approximately \$550.00. Comparably speaking, Washington can well afford this high cost for its elementary pupils which is better than two hundred fifty dollars above the state average because this same report indicates that while the average equalized valuation per pupil in New Hampshire is \$24,564; Washington has \$47,749 of equalized valuation behind each pupil. Also while the average equalized school tax rate in New Hampshire is \$1.47; Washington is \$1.22, which indicates that even though Washington has a high per pupil cost, their financial assessment is well below the state average.

Why do I include this information in my report? Well, as a professional educator, I believe you should have all the information available to you when you are asked to make judgements on problems pertaining to the education of your youth.

The forthcoming legislative session could have some very interesting proposals which could affect Washington. I will try to keep you informed and hope that if the need be, there will be citizens in the community who will be willing to attend legislative hearings to protect its interest.

It has been a pleasure to work again this year with the School Board, teachers, pupils, and citizens of Washington and I appreciate their cooperation.
