To the Inhabitants of the Town of Washington, in the County of Sullivan, in said State, qualified to vote on Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Washington on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- Art. 1. To elect a Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, one Selectman for three years, Road Agent, Tax Collector, Auditor, Fire Chief, Police Chief, one member of the Library Committee for three years, one member of the Library Committee for one year, and other necessary Town officers.
- Art. 2. To see if the Town will vote to choose a Delegate to the Constitutional Convention.
- Art. 3. To see if the Town will vote on the question, "Shall Sweepstakes tickets be sold in this Town?"
- Art. 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$571.68 and accept State Aid of \$3,911.18 for Town Road Aid in said Town.
- Art. 5 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of high-ways and bridges for the ensuing year.
- Art. 6. To hear the report of the Town History Committee and to see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the use of the committee.
- Art. 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Charges for the ensuing year.
 - Art. 8. To see if the Town will authorize the Select-

men to borrow in anticipation of taxes.

- Art. 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Shedd Free Library for the ensuing year.
- Art. 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Fire Department for the ensuing year.
- Art. 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay on long term garage notes, \$1,000.00 of which is due.
- Art. 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region for 1964.
- Art. 13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Band Concerts.
- Art. 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to improve the new cemetery land in Washington Center.
- Art. 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purchase of Highway Equipment and authorize the Selectmen to borrow the necessary balance on long term notes.
- Art. 16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from Capital Reserve all of the money for Highway Equipment.
- Art. 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to build an addition onto the Town Garage and to authorize the selectmen to borrow the necessary balance on long term notes.
- Art. 18. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, and transfer to Capital Reserve, for Permanent Bridges.
- Art. 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be transferred to Capital Reserve for Highway Equipment.

- Art. 20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to relocate the Easterly approach to Purlingbeck Road and raise and appropriate a sum of money for same.
- Art. 21. To see if the Town will vote to re-appropriate the sum of \$50.00 (raised to improve the Public Beach at Millen Pond, 1963) for the improvement of said beach and facilities.
- Art. 22. "To see if the Town will vote to require all Town Officers to use the Washington, N. H. Post Office for all Town business as desired by voters who desire such a ruling." By Petition.
- Art. 23. To see if the Town will authorize the 4-H Club to restore the Tramp House with the supervision of the Selectmen or to take any other action relating there to.
- Art. 24. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND YOUR DISTRICT CHIEF

During the past year New Hampshire faced the greatest forest fire threat to its woodlands in more than sixty years. The continued drought brought home to our citizens, as never before, the potential threat of destructive fires to their beautiful and valuable forests, homes and livelihood. In true American tradition of meeting a common threat by volunteer effort, this fire danger was minimized by active prevention, patrol and a relinquishing of personnal rights for the common good. It was the greatest demonstration of public cooperation ever experienced by those responsible for local and state fire control. The ready forces of volunteer fire services kept the losses low. For their effort and public response the general fire service expresses its heartfelt thanks for a job well done.

Prevention however, is not just an activity for the bad fire years. It must be practiced until it becomes a part of our public conscience — a habit. Just plain carelessness with fire causes too many of our fires.

The following practices and suggestions will help:

- Always have a permit for outdoor burning and burn within the terms of the permit and in a safe place. Burn late in the afternoon when the wind is down or on rainy or damp days. Check your fire and if winds develop extinguish it promptly.
- Carry your rubbish to the public dump it's safer.
 A neglected backyard incinerator causes many fires.

- Never discard lighted cigarette or match. Make this a year round habit regardless of the safety of your surroundings.
- Children caused fires are now a major concern.
 Keep matches away from them and teach them to respect fire and not make it a subject of play.

Let's all join with "Smokey the Bear" and "Keep New Hampshire Green" and growing in 1964.

To the School Board and Citizens of Washington:

It is a pleasure for me to submit my tenth annual report for your consideration.

Enrollment at the Central School as of October 1, 1963, was as follows:

With four graduating from high school and three entering high school next fall, it would appear that our high school enrollment will not change to any great extent.

Your Board and I were disturbed considerably last spring when Mrs. Mulliner accepted a position at Hawthorne College and Mrs. Beard accepted the principalship at the Munsonville Elementary School for the school year 1963-64. Although we were happy to see these fine teachers receive professional advancement, we were disturbed that adequate replacements could not be obtained. However, your Board

was much more resourceful than I and prior to the opening of school was able to induce Mrs. Alice Read to return from Connecticut and accept the challenge of a school organized with grades 1 to 8 under one teacher. As many of you know, Mrs. Read is a very capable teacher with several years of experience and the pupils of the school are profiting under her direction.

There has been, and will continue to be over the years, study committees organized to determine whether it is advisable for communities in this area to join together for the purpose of providing education for the children of the area. The pressure for such action increased with the report of the interim Commission on Education and the action taken by the last session of the legislature. Such a committee is now holding meetings and the citizens of Washington should be represented. It well could be that no acceptable solutions are in the offering at the present time, but it seems inevitable that the time will come when Washington will find it desirable to become a part of a larger educational unit and whether it be now or in the far distant future, their representatives should be in at the planning stage to protect the interests of both the pupils and the citizens.

It has been a pleasure to work with the School Board, Citizens, Teacher, and Pupils of Washington and I appreciate the interest and cooperation given me.
