Wayland Wastewater Management District Hearing on FY2014 budget, betterments and rates

The Wayland Wastewater Management District (WWMD) Commission will hold a public hearing on the FY2014 budget, betterments, and rates.

The hearing will be held on Wednesday, 27 March 2013 at 7:30 PM at the Wayland Town Building, 41 Cochituate Road, Wayland, MA.

Status of Wayland Wastewater Management District

- New Wastewater Treatment Facility is operating
 - Opened on 7 Nov 2012
 - Should be good for 50 years
 - Total cost \$5.4M, significant new investment
 - Required due to aging Raytheon facility and new effluent standards
- Many new users
 - Wayland Meadows condos (31 users)
 - Two sets, before and after 20 Dec 2012
 - 13 Hastings Way users replaced by 16 River Rock users
 - 13 Hastings Way users now on private system
 - New Town Center businesses
 - First were Stop & Shop and Bertucci's (starting 7 Dec 2012)
 - · More businesses, as they open
 - Transfer of operational expenses from Twenty Wayland
 - Wastewater capacity for these users already allocated
- Surcharge being replaced by betterments
 - New bonds require principle and interest payments
 - Betterment can be charged in FY2014 due to WWTF completion

Factors Affecting FY2014 WWMDC Budget

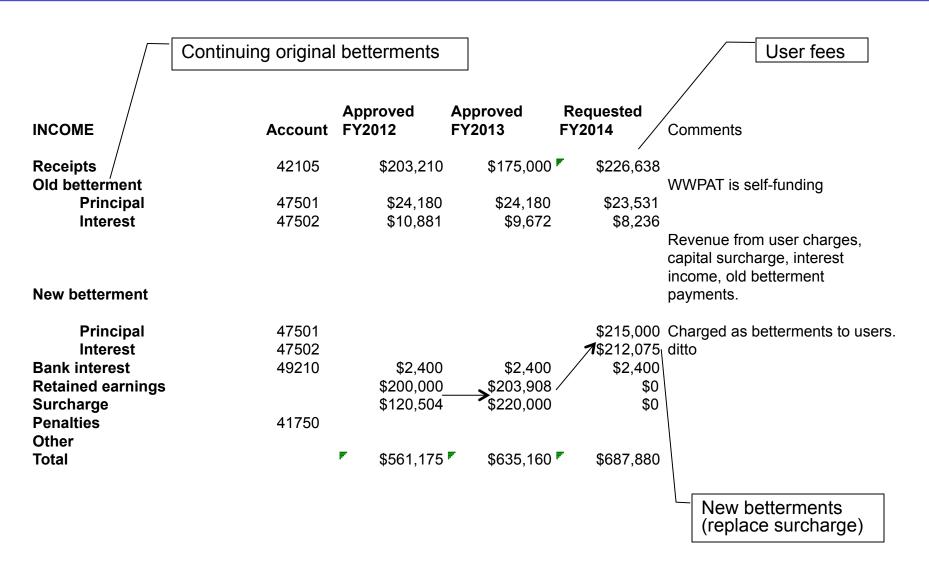
- Operating costs continue to be less with new contractor (Whitewater)
- Original betterments continue
- Borrowing for new Waste Water Treatment Facility completed
 - Finance Director deemed the borrowing climate best in FY2012
 - WWMDC agrees to borrow for 20 years
 - New betterments cannot be charged until WWTF completed
 - No more certified retained earnings applied as budget offset
 - Betterment added to tax bills (replaces surcharge)
- Proposed budget for FY2014 to be voted at Annual Town Meeting (see next slides)

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WWMD Income for FY2014



Operational Fees

- Calculated using capacities and estimated flows from all users
- Same formula used representing
 - 80% based on capacity (fixed costs)
 - 20% based on flow (variable costs)
- Rates increased from last year to raise more due to increased expenses
- Detailed calculation on handout

Betterments

- Calculated using capacities from all users
- Detailed calculation on handout

Future

- The new WWTF is costly but an investment that was necessary.
- Still searching for cause of excess flow.
 - Inspections turned up no obvious source
 - All users should check their systems periodically to detect infiltration
- DEP requiring additional leaching field
 - ONLY IF flow exceeds 80% capacity
 - Water conservation is an important part of WWMD operation
