TOWN OF WAYLAND BOARD OF ASSESSORS May 20, 2013

Chair S. Rufo called the meeting to order at 7:15pm.

In attendance: Chair S. Rufo, Vice-Chair J. Brodie, M. Upton, Director Ellen Brideau, Administrative Assessor Jessica Marchant

Minutes

J. Brodie moved that the minutes of May sixth be approved as presented. M. Upton seconded. Vote Unanimous

Correspondence:

The ATB notified the Board that they will take three additional months to complete the findings of fact in the case involving 35 Main Street.

The Department of Revenue announced the new Bureau Chief is Joanne Graziano.

Documents for BOA signature:

Motor Vehicle second commitment 2013 = \$247,079.34 Motor Vehicle eighth commitment 2012 = \$495.63 Real estate abatement March 2013 \$17,486.90

Director Brideau presented five circuit breaker applications that have been reviewed and meet the criteria. J. Brodie moved to accept the recommendation and approve by signature the five circuit breaker applications. S. Rufo seconded.

Director Brideau presented and recommended for denial two circuit breaker applications that don't meet the criteria because incorrect data was given. The board denied each circuit breaker by signature.

Director Brideau recommended denial of an exemption based on late filing per state law. The board denied by signature.

Supplemental Billing for FY13

Twenty one properties have received a certificate of occupancy since June 30, 2012. This created supplemental real estate taxes in the amount of \$91,026.67 and CPA of \$1,365.40.

J. Brodie asked what notification the property owner receives regarding supplemental billing. Director Brideau answered that they receive a letter explaining supplemental billing which is signed by both the Director of Assessing and the Tax Collector.

Topics not reasonably anticipated by the Chair 48 hours in advance

Regarding the schedule for board meetings within the next few months, Chair S. Rufo reviewed the board obligations and the obligations of staff related to inspections and data entry and proposed having one meeting in June to close the fiscal year and resume BOA meetings in August.

- M. Upton raised concerns about not meeting until August due to the full list and measure project.
- S. Rufo points out that Vision has until September 30th to complete that project.
- S. Rufo proposed a new format for communication. When the BOA has questions, send them to the Chair S. Rufo and she will relay them to Director Brideau prior to board meetings so she can prepare any necessary data.

Chair S. Rufo asked for Director Brideau to prepare a sampling of properties that have been reviewed/ inspected so when the board reviews the documents in September they have some background on trends that are affecting the values.

Thoughts and Concerns of the BOA

- M. Upton asked what it would take for the board to have access to the property record cards remotely. Director Brideau responded that the software user licenses restrict the number of users and that remote access into the town server would not be possible.
- M. Upton asked if the property record cards could be posted online. Director Brideau responded that she would research the cost and report back to the Board.
- M. Upton asked if the staff can handle all of the work they have going on with inspections of building permits, sales and cyclicals and the data entry for those. Does anyone need to be brought in to help? Director Brideau is confident the staff will complete the work.
- J. Brodie expressed concern that many abatement applications will be submitted in January due to the probability that the tax rate will go up. What might the board and the staff do to prepare the taxpayers? Perhaps warning those who had large assessment increases due to large scale building permits would help. Time spent limiting the need for abatements is time well spent.

- M. Upton suggested to emphasize in the press that we're in the 3rd year of full list and measure and to inform the residents that most houses have been inspected.
- S. Rufo asked if the impact notices can go out sooner.

Director Brideau replied that the full list and measure needs to be completed and then the data needs to get entered before the assessments can be done and impact notices sent out.

M. Upton asked if the impact notices can go out in batches.

Director Brideau confirmed that notices can't be sent until all of the values are set. She clarified the steps: 1st - the office staff has to enter the building permit and sales data. 2nd- the valuation model is developed. 3rd – Board review requires several meetings before final approval. Impact notices historically have been sent out in the beginning of November. Vision is only dealing with properties that weren't impacted by sales or building permits.

The next BOA meeting is set for June 24th.

The meeting after that will be at the end of August or beginning of September -TBD. Chair S. Rufo will contact the board members when a board meeting is needed.

Adjourn

J. Brodie moved to adjourn at 7:58pm. M. Upton seconded. Vote Unanimous.
