The nutrition program deficit is now under \$1,000, down from \$100,000 since Bay Path took it over. There is a new person dealing with insurance policy issues. Evelyn distributed a flyer on Healthy Living programs that lists lectures that are available through Bay Path.

The Finance Committee would like to have the COA spend more money from the account but Julie does not wish to spend money on items that will be used by the town more than by the COA. The center does need a software program for registering program participants, one that will separate in town and out-of-town registrants. "My Senior Center" software is good for pulling end-of-year information for the EOEA report but does not fulfill other department needs. The FinCom is looking into the feasibility of a separate account for a possible new facility.

	The 26 th Children's Holiday Shoppe was successfully held. The COA is developing a relationship with the new Veterans' agent. The November Veterans' program attracted more than 70 people. COA programs have been bumped about eight times during the month of November. The holiday luncheon is coming up as well as a second think tank luncheon. Julie is looking into a zip lining trip and is talking with Minute Man about woodworking classes.

SPACE INITIATIVE

DISCUSSION	Bill said he has met with members of the Planning Board and Finance Committee. There is no appetite for a new library but there are two options for COA space being discussed informally. One option would combine town offices and a senior center with 30,000 sf of retail space and a second option would put the senior center in the former day care center (10,000 sf) perhaps with a connector to a new gym/art center/auditorium. Bill has been talking to Aida but the library trustees were discouraged by the audit report.
