	As usual, the center has been busy. Sue is back, working part-time. The staff has worked together well and flexibly, aided by the open office space. There is a new partnership with the Wayland Stop and Shop. It will donate prepared deli foods two days a week that will be distributed in a 60 minute time period (Monday and Thursdays from 11 to 12). Fifteen to 20 people have taken part. Stop and Shop sent a flower arrangement for Valentine's Day.
DISCUSSION	There will be an insert for Mass Memories in the March newsletter. Bill Sterling has asked Julie to prepare a grid of when people come into and leave the center. The Art Center continues to be a problem: pottery classes leave a fine film on everything and the water color classes have to clean up before starting their lessons. New space should have clean art space and messy art space.
	The Energy Committee has asked Julie to list energy issues in the town building. The small conference room was as low as 42 degree this winter while exercise spaces can be very warm, requiring doors to be opened to lower the temperature. The floor in the senior center is uneven due to moisture under the building. The Town Report has gone to press.

RIVER'S EDGE PRESENTATION

DISCUSSION	 Becky Stanizzi described the changes that have been made to the plan presented last year. Only the rear of the building will have a fourth floor and it will include an elevator. The number of units has been reduced to a range of 150 to 190. A minimum of 25 percent of the units will be age restricted and 25 percent will be affordable. There will be three affordable units with three bedrooms while the remaining units will be one- and two-bedroom. One bedroom units will be about 600-650 square feet and two-bedroom units will be around 950 to 1,000 square feet. There will be few children because the units are small. There will be some underground parking in the rear of the building. There were questions about the cell towers. Currently it is possible to site four towers in the cell tower district. River's Edge would reduce that number to three. There are no archeological concerns. After the presenters left, the board discussed the project. They liked the age mix, felt the project would be good for seniors, and thought it important to increase the amount of affordable housing in town. Bill said it is our one chance to improve a major entrance to Wayland; he likes the design guidelines. The board likes the idea of a diner in the facility as a way to bring the community to the building.
