#### PUBLIC COMMENT AND DISCUSSION

DISCUSSION	Bill called the meeting to order with a discussion of next steps for the COA/CC. He said the committee has done its job, especially raising awareness of the need for a larger facility for the COA. He reported on the meeting of the Board of Selectmen on the previous night. There was general agreement among the board that until the site is under town control, there is little the committee can do. Jean Milburn said that the town will get the site eventually because the developer has a contractual obligation to donate at least two plus acres. She believes the project is within striking distance and should continue to move forward. The Economic Development Committee (EDC) is meeting with the town center property manager at its meeting on Thursday and is committed to the project. Julie added that the COA has approval from the MWRTA to run the COA van from passengers' homes to the town center, CVS, and the library. Jean also suggested that the COA staff meet with faith leaders to inform them of the COA services that are available to their congregants.
ACTION	There should be a series of short articles about how individuals use the COA, showing the breadth of available services and the wide range of age groups served. Suggestions include the SHINE Counselors, Pilates groups, bridge group, and the Golden Tones.

# **DIRECTOR'S REPORT**

DISCUSSION	Julie reported that the volunteer luncheon was a great event; there were 80 to 85 people in attendance. With the increase in the number of people requesting meals, the number of routes has increased from two to three. That means that there are nearly 20 volunteers each week to pick up and deliver meals and make a social contact. The Ameresco presentation on the upcoming solar project was very well attended. The summer concert series is ready to roll. The Aging Mastery class is already 65 percent subscribed and the program doesn't start until September. Julie recently learned that MWRTA drivers can go to the door to assist clients to the bus. There will be some transportation funds returned to the town because the shuttle service did not start as early as planned. Julie had hoped that a tax work-off participant could drive the van since the IRS views tax work-off participants as town employees and as such they could be covered by the town's insurance policy. However the insurance company views them as volunteers who are not covered. Obviously the IRS and the insurance company don't coordinate their rulings. There might be a tax work-off participant who would be willing to coordinate the spotlight on seniors PR campaign. As more town departments put their applications and other documents online, older residents need more assistance from the staff to assist them to utilize electronic town government services such as water abatements.
