A.Irwin opened the meeting at 7:32 PM noting that a quorum was present.

1. 7:32 pm - Citizens Time

No comments were offered.

2. Minutes – September 27, 2012

Motion to accept the September 27 Meeting Minutes as edited; Seconded 4-0

3. Rice Road Dam

B.Monahan reported there was a new door installed today, along with a new lock and key.

4. 7:35 pm – Continued Public Hearing, Ken Chase, New Wampum Realty, Applicant, 22 Plain Road, DEP File No. 322-789: Notice of Intent filed pursuant to the Wetlands Protection Act, G.L. ch. 131 s. 40 and the application filed pursuant to Wayland's Wetlands and Water Resources Bylaw, Chapter 194 by Ken Chase, New Wampum Realty. The applicant is proposing to renovate the existing dwelling and regrade a portion of the rear yard at 22 Plain Road, Wayland, MA. The existing dwelling foundation will remain with the only changes being an addition to the rear of the garage and adding a larger rear deck. Applicant also proposes to add a roof infiltration system and plant 6 1-inch caliper Red Maple Trees. The property is shown on Wayland's Assessor's Map 24, Parcel 128.

Ken Chase was present for the discussion. A.Irwin commented that new plans were delivered to the Conservation office and sent to Commissioners electronically. Ken Chase reminded Commissioners of the project proposal to reconstruct the existing home on the same footprint with a small addition to the back of the garage along with regrading of the yard, extending with fill to 30-35 feet while creating a lawn area. A.Irwin asked for confirmation of the slope on the back side being 2.5:1, which Mr. Chase confirmed.

Mr. Chase reported that the NGVD datum is now on the plan, along with existing vs. proposed impervious surface data and limit of lawn. Mr. Chase confirmed the addition of ten 2-3 foot tall silky dogwoods and noted that they have increased the size of the red maples from 1" caliper to 2.5" caliper. Mr. Chase indicated on the plan in the front of the property where they added a stonewash area for construction vehicles off to the left side of the driveway. A stockpiling area is planned in the front area of the property where it is flat. Brief discussion ensued of the approach for access on the property. A.Irwin inquired about tree replacement and Mr. Chase reminded the Commission that of the trees proposed for removal, only three are in the buffer zone and offset plantings were discussed.

B.Monahan proposed considering roping off the infiltration area, and A.Irwin commented that they could either rope it off or when they go to install it, they could perc test the hole – one or the other. B.Howell raised the issue of the swale that had been discussed previously. A.Irwin reminded Mr. Chase of the importance of having sufficient sediment and erosion control where flow is concentrated into a channel by proposed grading with a slight swale on the east side in the back. While discussing hydroseeding, B.Monahan commented that they can add hay bale check dams in the swale, and the use of a jute blanket or other stabilizing system on the entire back slope was recommended to Mr. Chase. Discussion ensued regarding the need for clean fill, and A.Irwin cautioned that there must be no recycled "ABC" (asphalt/brick/concrete) fill used. B.Monahan noted that the standard clean fill condition will be included in the Permit.

A.Irwin stressed the Commission's focus on the acquisition of land and the process of identifying appropriate targets in the coming months. Discussion ensued of a four-acre parcel on Plain Road, among others. B.Monahan proposes to approach the CPC to initiate a discussion. Discussion ensued on access points on various parcels. A.Irwin noted that B.Monahan will speak to Joy Viola for assistance with this effort.

8. Compliance Updates/Complaints

a. Wayland High School

A.Irwin sent a letter today to the High School Building Committee and John Moynihan addressing concerns and copies were previously sent to Commissioners.

9. Land Management (continued)

A.Irwin addressed with the Commission the matter of the Lord Parcel – the entrance to the landfill. A.Irwin read an excerpt from the 1978 Town Meeting Minutes which summarized that Lot B was to be transferred to the Conservation Commission for Conservation purposes when no

longer required for other its initial purposes (sanitary landfill, sand and gravel operation). A.Irwin noted a recent communication dated August 23, 2012 from Mark Lanza concerning that parcel. A.Irwin plans to take this matter on in November. B.Howell recalled that this area was the access for the landfill and once the landfill was capped, that was to shift to Conservation. A.Irwin indicated that any shift from the original intended objective would have to override the 1978 Town Meeting.

10. Other

- a. FY 2014 Budget Guidelines
 - B.Monahan reported that the guidelines are out, and a 10% cut is required. B.Monahan reviewed changes to seasonal help with additional person now working several weeks in the fall season for trail mowing, etc. B.Monahan will get a budget narrative together to share with the Commission.
- FY 2014 Capital Budget
 B.Monahan will work in the Rice Road dam information, and A.Irwin confirmed that all of the recommended repairs from GZA should be included in its entirety.
- c. Temporary Tree Study Committee B.Monahan will discuss with Joy Viola.
