# Claypit Hill Elementary - Windows and Doors - MSBA Accelerated Repair Program

Invoices for Pinck & Co, Inc. the owner's project manager (OPM) and CGKV Architects, Inc. the project architect were presented for approval. Discussion ensued regarding the OPM's invoice. It appeared that the numbers did not correspond to the amount being invoiced. After not being able to determine the correct numbers to reference for the OPM's invoice it was decided to approve the project architect's invoice but to not approve the OPM's.

Motion to approve CGKV Architects, Inc, invoices totaling \$20,066.50 moved, seconded, and approved by a vote of 6-0.

Ben Keefe is to contact Pinck & Co, Inc. and request invoices that clearly indicate the amount of the contract, the work performed to date, and the work remaining to be accomplished.

# **DPW Project Update**

Joshua Sydney provided an update on the Project:

Construction update:

- 1. Site work is still an issue. The binder course is still not in place and access to the salt shed is at the best difficult. Negotiations are currently underway to exchange a temporary access road to the salt shed for a time extension. PMBC instructed John Moynihan and Joshua Sydney to make a deal tomorrow and insure there is access to the salt shed.
- 2. Roof is 85% complete

- 3. There is an issue with temporary heat. Determining best way to accomplish and meet Building Inspectors safety requirements for fuel storage.
- 4. Over- all the project is a little behind schedule. Substantial completion date is Apr 15, 2015 with a 30 day punch list timeframe. There are liquidated damages on the project but Joshua thinks that he contractor will be able to accomplish the project on schedule.

## Change Order Review:

CR #13-R1 has been negotiated with the Contractor. CR #6, relating to the handling of excess earthwork material, is to be reviewed by Joshua for an interpretation of the Contract Documents and further discussion with the PMBC. The balance of Changes are relatively minor.
