Water Superintendent Don Millette provided a guided tour for the WPC of the new Baldwin Treatment Facility. Plant construction of this state-of-the-art facility is essentially completed. Plant features are impressive; the tour was exciting and informative.

Testing to meet DEP requirements and resolving site issues with the utilities are among the remaining steps. The water division budgets include provisions for increased operating costs. The estimated target for beginning to use the plant is the end of this calendar year.

Once the new plant is in operation, Baldwin wells will be the major drinking water source for the town, which raises the priority level for protecting those wells. Water from other wells will be added to meet the demand. It is expected that Happy Hollow wells would be used mainly in the summer.

A ribbon-cutting ceremony is tentatively scheduled for November 14, 2009
