The Minutes of the October 20, 2001 meeting were read and accepted.

The Board members agreed to continue to press to have a third member appointed to the Historical Review Board as well as an alternate member if possible.

Before the meeting the members had visited the site (map 19, lot 72) at 60 Way 55 which abuts The Colony and has access only on a road that runs through The Colony. The Historical Review Board received from the Building Inspector, Mr. Azman, copies of a proposal to destroy a house and two small outbuildings on that site and to build there a new house, the required plans and photographs for which were submitted by Gerald Parent, agent for Edith Harris, owner of the property. The Board also received a letter from Eleanor Stefani and Robert Hankey who asked the Board to hold a public hearing concerning the proposed demolition of the structure which they referred to as Cottage 10 at the Colony of Wellfleet. They pointed out that the structure in question had been designed and built by the architects Nathaniel Saltonstall and Peter Morton.

Action taken: The Board voted to advertise a public hearing to be held on December 6, 2001 in the Hearing Room of the Town Hall at 7 p.m. and to inform the petitioners of that decision. Notice of the public hearing will also be sent to Gerald Parent, representative of Edith Harris, the owner and to the resident of the house, Robert Metcalf at 151 Brookside Drive, Rochester, N. Y. , as well as to Richard Azman, Building Inspector.
