

Town of Wellfleet - Board of Selectmen Wellfleet Council of Aging August 12, 2008 Regular Meeting - Minutes

Chair Jacqui Beebe called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Selectmen present included Dale Donovan, Michael May and Ira Wood. Town Administrator Paul Sieloff also attended.

Public Hearing

Animal Control Officer Lorial Russell presented information on two unrestrained pit bulls at Pine Point Rd. Since April 9, there have been numerous complaints about the dogs. She had several letters regarding the dogs running loose. Russell stated for the record that the dogs be confined to a fenced in yard with a locked gate. She said that if that fails, she would like to see the white, aggressive male pit bull removed from town. May established that pit bulls in Wellfleet need to be muzzled. Sam. Scherer, owner of the male pit bull, said that they are constructing a new fence for the yard. Mrs. Scherer said that the young male dog is to be neutered. Neighbors and abutters discussed the dogs. Police Chief Rosenthal said he agreed with the dog officer. Chair Beebe said there were 12 cases of the dogs running loose, which violates Town bylaws. She said the situation needed to be resolved as soon as possible. Donovan said that the leash law and the muzzle for pit bulls should be enforced.

MOTION 08-0239: To move the following findings:

- 1.) There have been numerous complaints about the American Staffordshire terriers a.k.a. pit bulls, since April 9, 2008.
- 2.) Specific complaints have been made about the white, male pit bull
- 3.) There are additional complaints about a brindle-colored, female pit bull.
- 4.) The dates of the incidents include: April 9, April 20, April 27, June 8, June 11, July 7, July 15, July 17, July 20, July 22, July 24 and July 27.

MOTION 08-0240: To move to follow recommendation of dog officer that all three dogs are to be fenced in secure facility with a locked gate. If there is a further reported incident, the dogs are to be banished from the Town.

Dale Donovan announced that the Cape Cod Commission's Environmental Review of the Herring River Restoration Project would be held Thursday, August 14 at the Senior Center.

Paul Sieloff reported on the energy audit of Town facilities. He said the audit was for electric facilities only, and there will be further audits on heating. New light fixtures and monitors will be installed over the next month at no cost to the Town. Sieloff said that five other recommendations would be considered. An Energy Star Building Award for Town Hall had been awarded from a past audit of the Town, Sieloff said. There is an award plaque which will be installed at Town Hall.

Non-commercial signs bylaw amendment

Paul Sieloff discussed a possible non-commercial sign bylaw amendment. He said that the Building Inspector had received complaints about sandwich board signs on Town Hall lawn and at the lights on Route 6. The bylaw was enforced briefly, but since there were only a few weeks left to summer the ban was lifted. An amendment to the bylaw was suggested for Special Town Meeting. Donovan said a bylaw change might allow for signs with Selectmen approval with conditions for non-profit groups. Sieloff said he was already working on drafting a bylaw to deal with signs. Building Inspector Paul Murphy discussed off-premise signs and enforcement issues. He said he would like to see the bylaw amendments referred to Planning Board. Donovan mentioned a past practice of notifying realtors of sign bylaws with an annual notice. Two home occupation, small business owners expressed the hope that there would be some leeway for off-premise signs for their out of the way locations. Ron Harper discussed temporary sign permits by the Building Inspector with a fee for the Town.

Proposed FY2010 Budget Policy

A discussion of the Budget Policy Letter for FY2010 was planned with Finance Committee at the joint meeting to be held September 9, 2008. Finance Chair Patricia Foley proposed holding a separate meeting to deal with Budget. Donovan discussed Charter amendments that deal with the Budget process.

Proposed Topics for Fall Special Town Meeting

Paul Sieloff said he had put together the topics he thought would be on the Fall Special town Meeting. These include: Seashore zoning bylaw amendments; a non-commercial

The Selectmen discussed forwarding Town Counsel's letter regarding the role of Town Counsel. Paul Sieloff said that Kopelman & Paige had sent a letter a few weeks ago, and he suggested that the letter be forwarded to all boards and committees.

Rex Peterson explained changes to the proposed zoning bylaw revisions that deal with Seashore building. One change in 6.1.5 applies to the Town as a whole.

Attorney Ben Zehnder asked if the Selectmen had read the document and asked about procedure. He said that the draft would freeze zoning with the first publication of the advertisement. Chairman of the Planning Board Dennis O'Connell said the revision would be arriving at the Planning Board as a petitioned Article. Ben Zehnder said if the draft was to be published August 29 and zoning frozen, there should be a public hearing

by the Town first. Planning Board cannot make changes to the document, according to O'Connell. Donovan said it was not a petitioned Article. Ben Zehnder said that the bylaw changes were significant and were not what had been talked about by Planning Board.

Tom Rinehart spoke in favor of moving forward with the bylaw revision and bringing it to a public hearing. Donovan spoke about the freeze that would be placed on building.

MOTION 08-0245: To move to amend his motion to send to PB for a public hearing after Rex Peterson has consulted with Town Counsel on the procedural questions

O'Connell asked about Donovan's revised motion and urged the other members to vote against it. From the floor, Brent Herold and John Williams, Chairman of the Boundbrook Island Rd. Homeowners Association, spoke in favor of resolving the bylaw changes. Donovan discussed the language in the new proposal. Beebe said she had agreed to suggestions for revision but upon reviewing the current document in public, she had many concerns she wanted answered before going forward.

Donovan and Wood withdrew the original motion.

MOTION 08-0246: To move to withdraw his amended motion until a BOS meeting August 19, 2008 with Town Counsel addressed the questions of procedure of sending the Zoning bylaw changes from the Board of Selectmen to the Planning Board.

There was further discussion of the proposed changes from the floor and by the Selectmen.

Old Business

Paul Sieloff revisited the parking enforcement issue. There were two issues: Town Hall parking lot and former church parking lot parking. The Methodist Church and Congregational Church had a proposal for use of their lots. Sieloff recommended that for the rest of the summer the Town continue with the Police Chief's policy that was in effect.

Chief Rosenthal gave a report on vehicle speeds on Commercial Street. Chief Rosenthal had sent up a traffic monitoring computer which indicated speeds that were mainly in compliance. Chief Rosenthal had requested that DPW set up speed limit signs on Commercial St.
