- Approved meeting minutes from November 7, 2016 with a clarification on (3). A discussion at Fall Town Meeting *suggested* selectmen conduct a town wide traffic study. No vote was taken.
- 2. It was mentioned Brendan Hanrahan was not listed as a member on the BPAC website. It was agreed this should be corrected.
- 3. Previously scheduled traffic meeting to discuss the Road Safety Audit (RSA) had been cancelled due to illness.
 - a. This meeting will be rescheduled in the coming weeks.
 - i. Issues include, but not limited to, parking reorientation in the rotary, signage on roadway, traditional signage "diet"
 - ii. Moving forward with the E. Main to Lyman Street multi-use trail project was also mentioned.

 - a. Detailed emails composed by BPAC member Don Burn were referenced as a blueprint of what was necessary to properly prepare for the February 1, 2017 Recreational Trails Grant deadline. (Bridge over Assabet River)

 - d. Benefit of engaging other communities was discussed. Allows grant award of up to \$100,000.00
