GREETINGS:

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are directed to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of West Boylston qualified to vote in elections and town affairs, to meet in the Auditorium of the Middle/High School in said Town on Monday, October 18, 2004 at 7:00 p.m. in the evening, then and there to act on the following articles.

ARTICLE 1 - AUTHORIZATION TO HEAR THE REPORTS OF OFFICERS AND COMMITTEES OF THE TOWN

To see if the town will vote to hear and accept the reports of the officers and standing committees of the town, or take any other action relative thereto.

<u>ARTICLE 2 – APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS FOR TAX TITLE EXPENSES</u>

To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from available funds the sum of Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars and No Cents to Tax Title Expenses Account to be expended by the Treasurer/Tax Collector for expenses related to tax title work, or take any other action relative thereto.

<u>ARTICLE 3 – APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS FOR MEMORIAL DAY EXPENSES</u>

To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from available funds the sum of One Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirteen Dollars (\$1,813.00) and No Cents for the purpose of celebrating Memorial Day, or take any other action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 4- AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE XIV - LICENSES AND PERMITS SECTION 5.

- MOTEL OPERATION PERMIT TO INCLUDE HOTELS

To see if the town will vote to amend Article XIV Licenses and Permits as follows:

To Delete the following text,

"Section 5. – Motel Operation Permit

No person shall operate a motel, as defined in G.L. c.64G, §1(e), but excluding private clubs, without securing a permit from the Board of Selectmen in addition to any other permits or licenses required by state or local law or regulations. The Board of Selectmen may promulgate regulations to implement this bylaw, and may revoke the permit for violation of this bylaw and regulations adopted hereunder."

And Insert in place thereof:

"Section 5. – Motel/Hotel Operation Permit

No person shall operate a motel or hotel, as defined in G.L. c.64G, §1(c) §1(e), but excluding private clubs, without securing a permit from the Board of Selectmen in addition to any other permits or licenses required by state or local law or regulations. The Board of Selectmen may promulgate regulations to implement this bylaw, and may revoke the permit for violation of this bylaw and regulations adopted hereunder."

or take any other action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 5- ACCEPTANCE OF MASSACHUSETTS GENERAL LAWS CHAPTER 32, SECTION 89B

To see if the town will vote to accept the provisions of Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 32, Section 89B, Annuities to dependents of police officers or fire fighters killed in performance of duty, which will pay a part-time police officer or call firefighter's widow 2/3 of the salary of a full-time police officer or firefighter.

Or take any action related thereto.

ARTICLE 6 - AUTHORIZATION TO AMEND TOWN MEETING ARTICLE 3 OF THE

SEPTEMBER 28, 1981 ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

To see if the town will vote to amend Article 3 of the Sept. 28, 1981 Annual Town Meeting by inserting the following after Massachusetts General Laws;

"With the authority to expend funds necessary for repairs, maintenance and preservation of Historic artifacts."

So that the amended article would read as follows;

"The fund will be administered by the Historical Commission, acting as the Board of Trustees, as authorized under Chapter 40, Section 8d of the Massachusetts General Laws, with the authority to expend funds necessary for repairs, maintenance and preservation of Historic artifacts."

Or take any action relative thereto.

ARTICLE 7 - AUTHORIZATION TO TRANSFER A PARCEL OF LAND

To see if the Town will vote to transfer the care, custody, management and control of all or a portion of the parcel of land described below, the extent of said portion to be determined by the board or officer presently having custody of such land, from the Board of Selectmen for town common purposes, to the Board of Selectmen for the purpose of conveyance, and to further authorize the Board of Selectmen, on such terms and conditions as they may determine, to convey said portion in fee simple to Fay Brothers Funeral Home, said parcel being described as follows:

That parcel of land bounded on the south by Lot 76 on Assessor's Map 148, on the west by Lot 77 on Assessor's Map 148, and on the north and east by Church Street, a public way;

and further to authorize the Board of Selectmen to seek legislative approval for such conveyance under Article 97 of the Amendments to the Massachusetts Constitution, if necessary, provided that the General Court may vary the form and substance of the requested legislation within the scope of the general public objectives of such a petition, and further to authorize the Board of Selectmen to seek such approval for such conveyance from the courts of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, as may be necessary, should the parcel be determined to be held in trust for its present purpose, or to take any other action relative thereto.

And you are directed to serve this Warrant by posting an attested copy thereof at the place of said meeting as aforesaid and at the Post Office in said Town fourteen (14) days at least before the

time of said meeting.
