#### TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT

Town Manager, Richard White reported on a fire at 67 Wilshire St. There were no injuries; no one was hurt however the home was lost. White extended his thanks for a heroic achievement for the Fire Dept. who performed admirable for fire professionals on an incredibly cold evening. Chief Powers and Richard White recognized the incredible logistical support received from our Police and Public Works Dept. Together the 3 entities worked as a team managing a situation-working arm and arm each playing a fairly significant roll a well as the Fire Dept. of Chelsea, Revere and Massport who were fighting the fire with Winthrop as well as Boston and Everett who covered our stations.

The status of most budgets has not changed since the last report of the first quarter, still maintaining the existing staff levels. Generally it has been a pleasant, successful year managing the budget with a 125,000. Reserve Fund being at the halfway point. Mr. White will update the Council in March specifically with the Police and Fire before anything is done in terms of staffing levels.

Mr. White also reports after some protracted and contentious negotiations he has finalized and signed a 5-year contract between the Town of Winthrop and Comcast, 1% going to the schools and 4% toWCAT.

Mr. White also updated the Council on the RPF responses for the Dalrymple School. Three viable bids worth a fairly thorough examination can take place between now and one of the March Council meetings.
