DCR PRESENTATION

Joe Orfant is introduced to present a DCR presentation/update on the Winthrop Beach Project

Phase II will begin the first week of Jan. sand will start moving. Hoping by next summer, beach will be extended.

Next spring northern end of beach will begin. Trying numerous ways to help with the impacting of Winthrop.

Biggest impact at this time is trucking. Have reduced trucks by 20% and will work with schools and residents during particular hours. Truck contractors will be monitored closely as to not cause a great impact on Winthrop Residents. Intent of project is to provide security to our shoreline.

Guy Brandenstein has concerns on how much of the beach will be accessible to the community and how much for the endangered bird species. He has seen drawings of the percents of community vs. endangered species.

Joe Orfant is not sure of what drawings Mr. Brandenstein is looking at but assures that as a community and through the state the DCR has a responsibility for these species. It is just not protecting this species, it is educating the community of the importance of our environment.

President Gill acknowledges the professionalism of the DCR with our community during this project.

TOWN COUNCIL MEETING OF DECEMBER 18, 2012

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No Further Comment on Emergency Sewer Transfer

Public Hearing on the Water Meter Replacement Bond Issue: Town Manager McKenna opens public hearing on the financing option of ½ (\$750,000) of the 1.5 million estimated cost of the water meter replacements. Why just half at this point? MWRA will only allow the town to apply for this amount at this time. We cannot apply for more than we are guaranteed at this particular time and Mr. McKenna will be looking into different finance options for the completion of this project. Mr. McKenna explains the importance of having these meters replaced. The benefits are for both the community and town. Residents will be able to manage their water use from their own computers. The town will have online access to managing water use, saving on manpower, operating costs, unaccounted water etc. This is a key tool to help manage with all water distribution in this town.

Councilor Sanford: What is timeline for this projects completion?

Town Mgr. McKenna: Obviously as soon as we are able.

Councilor Sanford: What neighborhoods would this project begin with?

Steve Calla: Depending on entire financing, it is just not meters, infrastructure and meters are involved and could begin.

Councilor Boncore: Are we holding project until we receive all funding?

Town Mgr. McKenna: We need to go forward with this initial amount (\$750,000) once we know rate structure and loan amount needed we can apply for the completion cost of the project.

Councilor Boncore: Can we hold this amount until we receive the completed financing?

Town Mgr. McKenna: MWRA has put no conditions as of yet

At this time, it is projected that this project would cost the homeowner \$350 that can be spread over 5 years. This goes onto the water rate not the tax bill.

Steve Calla discusses the costs of this project and how it will help the community.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Trish Harrington commented on section of Ingleside Park, where a tree was planted being a Memorial Park for deceased students of Winthrop Public Schools. Can council consider this? Second item concerning her is the voting booths at the Senior Center. Can these booths be corrected?

Superintendent Macero comments on the Newtown CT tragedy and how our schools have taken the necessary safety actions and have a plan in place and will be practicing this plan for the community to be assured of the security of these buildings.

President Gill commends Mr. Macero and his staff on the opening of the schools after this tragedy and how the students are contributing to Newtown CT.

CORRESPONDENCE

Congratulations to the Town of Winthrop for being designated as a Green Community from the Dept. of Energy Resources. Along with this designation the Town is receiving a grant of \$169,625.00. Many thanks to Town Mgr. McKenna and Mr. Peter Lombardi for their hard work on having our community recognized and receiving this grant.

There was a presentation from the MAPC Guidelines for the development of the town. Peter Roche, chairman of the planning board requested Mr. McKenna and Mr. Lombardi to get together and work on this program. This is a positive meeting for each department head working together. It can be seen on WCAT.

John Macero sent a letter that multiple charitable associations are getting together to help contribute to the Newtown CT. tragedies.

We received communication from Suffolk Downs officially recognizing Winthrop as a surrounding community as to setting up guidelines with other surrounding communities.

COMMITTIES NEW ORTO

Councilor DelVento reports on the Finance Committee Meeting/ Council Clerk Committee December 13, 2012 Councilor Varone and Councilor Mael present. Discussed duties of council clerk and compensation. Items will be posted on next agenda for action as came in too late for the December 18, 2012 meeting. Still working with CFO for current fees.

Councilor Boncore reports on the Rules and Ordinance Committee Meeting on December 13, 2012, with Councilor Varone, Councilor DelVento, also in attendance Councilor Mael and Richard Dimes.

Agenda:

Rooming House Ordinance: Issue was tabled for any rooming house ordinance at this time since Winthrop does not have any rooming houses.

Boat Donation Policy Review: There should be a policy and a process for accepting all types of donations, refer this issue to the Town Manager. Town Manager McKenna acknowledges this but it is a difficult thing to put a policy of donations for different issues. Doesn't want to interfere with people donating because of certain donation rules. **Dog Licensing Fee:** Move to New Business, as has an ordinance to amend.

TOWN MANAGER REPORT:

Concerns of the safety and security of our public facilities and buildings: Chief Delehanty and Chief Flanagan discuss the recommendations and plans received from appropriate department heads to assure our safety. Educate our community on these plans and early warning systems. The School Committee is having special meeting on these concerns. Town Manager McKenna wants the town to know that we have been working on a safety plan for over a year and how we are working to protect all facilities in our town and our community.

Every year water and sewer rates are discussed. We need to make sure our rates are covering our expenses. Steve Calla will update on our rates and water and sewer systems. (See Attached Information). We are seeing water and sewer liens climbing since last year. This is a considerable issue at this time. People are cutting back on water use, close to \$100,000 in lost revenue this year. Liens are costing loss in revenue. Our largest lost revenue is on our unaccounted water (water theft/tampering) this is close to a loss in revenue of close to \$2 Million Dollars. Our other losses are slow meters, leakage etc. Our new water meter system will help this problem immensely.

Town Manager McKenna has been notified by the DOR he must make a rate adjustment. No motion is needed from council.

We have the chore of developing a Green Community plan and determine how we will use the grant money the state has approved to us. The funds are dedicated to Winthrop but the state must approve plans prior to full grant. Town Manager McKenna has re-introduced the Habitation Inspection Ordinance Proposal and would like council to reconsider and re-introduce this proposal. He would like to see the council institute a habitation inspection. He will introduce a motion after council discussion.

Councilor Boncore states that 2 years ago this proposal was introduced with landlords and was not adopted.

Town Manager McKenna is looking over the next couple of weeks of updating the Fee Compendium and will forward to finance.
