PRESENTATION

Town Mgr. McKenna introduces Michael Kane and Clint Shuckle from Siemens Corporation for a presentation of improving the town's streetlights by converting to LED. National Grid now accepts the same tariff with Siemens allowing a savings on our energy bill and the town can have more efficient streetlights. Maintenance cost will dramatically be reduced as lights will now have a warranty of 10 years and a life span of 20 years.

TOWN MANAGER REPORT

- -Town Mgr. McKenna has appointed a new Library Director, Peter Struzziero
- -Town Mgr. introduces Chief Flanagan regarding cooling stations during the heat wave, the official station will be the Senior Center and 9 Golden Dr., during normal business hours.
- -Town Mgr. introduces DPW Director Steve Calla who updates on street lights, sidewalks and Radio Read. New Town Recycle Barrels will be dispersed.

Councilor Boncore comments on improvement of Yirrell Beach and would like barrels and a lifeguard on this beach. DPW Director Calla comments that barrel's on the beach itself is problematic, barrels have been put at entranceways. Town Mgr. McKenna does encourage "carry in, carry out" policy with individuals trash. He will look into a lifeguard for this beach.

- -Dalrymple School project is beginning, permits have been pulled and construction should begin after Labor Day.
- -The tidal pool (lagoon) will be restored at Yirrell Beach.
- -Town Mgr. McKenna will be meeting with the engineers on the 2013 Coastal Protection Infrastructure Inventory and Assessment within the work being done on our shorelines and beaches.
- -Town Mgr. McKenna has been talking with MGH Hospital Center for Community Health Improvement and they have agreed to assist our town in conducting a Community Health Needs Assessments with our concerns of public health (Children, Senior Citizens..etc.).
- -Tim Gordon gives a closing on FY13.

Jean Maggio comments on the 5000 steps to 5000 miles walk and hopes to get participants.

OLD_BUSINESS

Rental Property Registration and Inspection Ordinance, postponed from July 2, 2013 meeting due to clerical corrections and several amendments.....

Town Mgr. McKenna circulated a new document that incorporated all changes and also changed the penalty section to reflect council's changes.

Motion by Councilor Letterie to adopt the amendment by Town Mgr. McKenna 8.40.110 reflection of the changes of the penalties.

Discussion-Councilor Boncore opposed

Passed 6-1 (Councilor Boncore-No / Councilor Sanford Absent / Councilor Mael Absent)

Councilor Mael recommends 8.40.020 Section D to add #3-

Motion by Vice President Varone that a property would be deemed a "Problem Property" except where a landlord has shown diligence in alleviating this issue. This exception would be valid if the problem is created/caused by a tenant, such as a domestic issue or if the landlord has defined and implemented an acceptable plan to mitigate the issue such as a formal eviction process. The hearing officer would be the arbiter of this decision.

Motion by Councilor Letterie to change B Violation Reference from 8.40.11 to 8.40.090 2nd by Councilor Powers

Motion by Councilor Letterie to Adopt the Main Motion as Amended

2nd by Councilor Powers

Discussion: Councilor Boncore believes this is a bad law, though the changes make this Main Motion "better", he does not agree with this motion.

Passed 6-1 (Councilor Boncore-No / Councilor Sanford Absent / Councilor Mael Absent)

SBAC sent a request for ballot question to be put on as discussion for the new Middle High School. Council President without objection will allow discussion to continue.

Councilor DelVento remarks that the Secretary of State announced a special election on Dec. 10, 2013 to fill the vacancy of Congressman's Markey's seat. It will be a free election for the town, it has a potential for this ballot.

As of this date, the council is not ready for the Nov.8, 2013 vote.

Subject: Seaview Ave Water Main Replacement Project Bond Issue

TEXT of MOTION

That \$275,000 is appropriated for the purpose of financing the replacement of aged water main and lead services on Seaview Avenue and Winthrop Street Extension, including all costs incidental and related there to; that to meet this appropriation the Treasurer with the approval of the Town Manager is authorized to borrow \$275,000 and issue bonds or notes of the Town under Chapter 44 of the General Laws; or any other enabling authority; that the Treasurer with the approval of the Town Manager is authorized to borrow all or a portion of such money from the Massachusetts Water resources Authority (the "Authority") and in connection therewith to enter into a loan agreement/or financial assistance agreement with the Authority and otherwise to contract with the Authority with respect to such loan and for any grants or aid available for the project or for the financing thereof, which grants and/or aid shall be expended for the project in addition to the amount appropriated and to be borrowed under this order; and that the Town Manager is authorized to acquire by purchase, eminent domain or otherwise, such rights, titles and easements as they may be necessary for such purpose, to abandon such rights, titles and easements as are no longer required, to expend all funds available for the project and to take any other action necessary to carry out the project.
