#### **TEXT OF MOTION**

I move that pursuant to Article 6-1 of the Town Charter, that the Town Council accepts the reorganization plan to consolidate the Town's Inspectional Services as presented by the Town Manager, to include sanitation and other public health inspection as required to be performed under various Codes of Regulation of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts; and further, that the Town's Code of Ordinances be amended accordingly to provide for this consolidation plan by adding a new section as specified below; and further, that the Council adopt the recommendation of the Town Manger to create the position of Commissioner of Inspectional Services to provide both managerial oversight of the Inspectional Services of the Town, and to ensure the proper administration and enforcement of all local, state, and federal laws appurtenant thereto; or take any action relative thereto.

## Chapter 2.50 Commissioner of Inspectional Services

#### Sections:

2.50.010 - Creation of Commissioner of Inspectional Services,
2.50.020 - Appointment—Term of office—Duties—Qualifications.

2.50.010 - Creation of Commissioner of Inspectional Services.

There shall be in the building department the Commissioner of Inspectional Services.

2.50.020 - Appointment—Duties—Qualifications.

The Town Manager shall appoint a Commissioner of Inspectional Services. Such Commissioner shall perform administrative, supervisory, inspection and investigative work related to the enforcement and interpretation of the Massachusetts State Building Code, local zoning ordinances, applicable state and local regulations, and other rules and statues specific to said office. The Commissioner will also manage and provide supervision to the following activities and/or agencies: Local Building Inspections, Rental Housing Inspections, Trash and Dumpster Inspection and Enforcement, Electrical

Inspections, Plumbing Inspections, Health and Sanitation Inspections, and Weights and Measures. This position will supervise employees, shall investigate and take action relative to complaints of violations of state rules and regulations or municipal ordinances, and conduct general inspections in the interest of protecting the general public. The Commissioner will provide zoning review, management oversight of all duties of the department, development and implementation of annual budgets, and review and propose any improvement to the department from time to time.

Supervise the inspection of wiring, piumbing, sanitation and health, heating systems and foundations during and after construction for structural quality, general safety and conformance to specifications and codes. Maintain daily logs; Review and interpret plans, blueprints, site layouts, specifications, and construction methods to ensure compliance to legal requirements and safety regulations; Inspect and monitor construction sites to ensure adherence to safety and elevation standards, building codes, and specifications; Issue violation notices and stop-work orders, conferring with owners, violators, and authorities to explain regulations and recommend permit resolution; Issue permits for construction, relocation, demolition and occupancy. Approve and sign plans that meet required specifications; Serve as lead office person in responding to questions from the public relating to building inspections, etc.
