CFO Tim Gordon discusses the current snow removal budget and how to move forward with recommendations for future snow removal budgets. Our current snow removal budget is \$90,000. Our current total cost is \$331,125.00, we are in a deficit of \$241,125. Each year the snow and ice budge has been increased by \$10,000, we should continue to do this. If you budget more than you incur, you are not able to carry as a deficit for the following year, it is a delicate balance. Our stabilization fund is to deal with extraordinary circumstances, which this year's snow removal is proving.

Summary of New Proposed Tobacco Regulations

Winthrop Board of Health

February 10, 2015

Proposed Regulations

- The existing Winthrop tobacco regulation is not consistent with the Massachusetts Smoke Free Workplaces Law
- Board of Health worked with tobacco control expert from the Massachusetts Municipal Association
- * Proposed new regulations:
- Restricting the Sale of Tobacco Products
- Prohibiting Smoking in Workplaces and Public Places

Background:

- Children in Winthrop living in high exposure areas are 3 to 4 times more likely to suffer from asthma
- Adults in Winthrop living in high exposure areas are more likely to suffer from COPD
- exacerbating asthma and COPD and to enforce "youth Winthrop take action to further reduce conditions workplace and housing programs." access and secondhand smoking laws and provide The Department of Public Health recommended that educational/outreach resources to support smoke-free

Background: Windhiop Community Health Needs Assessment

- Top 3 perceived health concerns in Winthrop
- * Substance abuse
- * Environment
- * Cancer
- Winthrop residents experience higher rates of asthma, COPD, and cancer than state average
- 2009 and 2011 data indicates that Winthrop high at rates higher than the state average school students use alcohol, tobacco, and marijuana

Summary of Proposed Changes

- Expand the definition of tobacco products to include non-regulated nicotine delivery products, including ecigarettes
- Require smoking cessation signage at stores that sel tobacco products
- Require minimum prices on cigars and packages of cigars to mirror minimum prices in Boston
- Cap Winthrop tobacco permits at 20

Summery of Proposed Changes


- * Increase minimum legal sales age for tobacco products from 18 to 21
- * Ban the sale of blunt wraps
- Ban self service displays and commercial "roll your own" machines
- Ban cigarette vending machines
- Ban sale of tobacco products in educational institutions

Summary of Proposed Changes

- Ban smoking and the use of tobacco products at Town parks, playgrounds, athletic fields, and beaches
- * Ban smoking and use of tobacco products in hotels
- Ban smoking and use of tobacco products in restaurants any place where wait staff serves food
- Prohibit the use of e-cigarettes in every location where use of regular cigarettes is prohibited

Notes

- The regulation does not prohibit rolling papers that are not composed of tobacco
- The regulation does not ban e-cigarettes; rather, the cigarettes as regular cigarettes regulation imposes the same restrictions on e-
- The regulation does not prohibit flavored cigars
