Chairman Senecal called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM at the Wolfeboro Public Library.

Mr. Owen stated a non-public session is needed to discuss personnel.

Ms. Silk amended page five, the fourth paragraph from the bottom to amend the first sentence after the word "which" to, the Board of Selectmen hired Attorney Slack as noted in the released portion of the non-public minutes of 11/5/08.

Member Marge Webster moved the Wolfeboro Board of Selectmen to approve the minutes of March 3, 2010 as amended. Member Linda Murray seconded. Chuck Storm-abstained and being none opposed, the motion passed.

Chuck Storm nominated Sarah Silk for Vice-Chairman. Linda Murray seconded. Members voted: Marge Webster and Dave Senecal-opposed, all others in favor, the nomination passed.

Mrs. Murray stated that it was brought to her attention that Suzanne Ryan, Jim Shildneck and David Booth were not included as members of the Master Plan Implementation Committee in the Town Report. She also noted that Master Plan Implementation Committee and the Milfoil Committee should be reviewed to include terms for the membership.

Mr. Owen replied such should be done, as it is good practice to have set terms on all committees.

Public Hearings

A. Temporary Event Permit Applications

1. New Hampshire Boat Museum to hold Model Yacht Sailing from April 1 through November 30, 2010 every Tuesday from 1:00-4:00 PM at the Bridge Falls Path to race toy sailboats on Back Bay.

Chairman Senecal opened the Public Hearing.

Mark Whitehead joined the Board for discussion and explained this is the 3rd season and that they have also received their permit to put in a dock in Back Bay for launching the boats.

Ms. Silk noted the notes on the permit from the Department Heads.

Mrs. Murray noted a new insurance certificate would be needed in June.

Being no others to speak for or against the request, Chairman Senecal closed the Public Hearing.

Member Sarah Silk moved the Wolfeboro Board of Selectmen to approve the temporary event permit for New Hampshire Boat Museum to hold Model Yacht Sailing from April 1 through November 30, 2010 every Tuesday from 1:00-4:00 PM at the Bridge Falls Path to race toy sailboats on Back Bay. Chuck Storm seconded. Being none opposed, the motion passed.

2. Kingswood Regional High School to hold the Prom Promenade through the Wolfeboro Community Bandstand and Cate Park to the MS Mount Washington on May 15, 2010 from 4:00-7:00 PM.

Chairman Senecal opened the Public Hearing.

Julie Best and Karen Godfrey joined the Board for discussion and explained this has been the annual tradition for the prom.

Ms. Silk noted the notes on the permit from the Department Heads.

Mrs. Murray noted the permit notes the parking lot would need to be blocked.

Mrs. Best replied that it would not need to be blocked, as that is not what they have done in the past.

Being no others to speak for or against the request, Chairman Senecal closed the Public Hearing.

Member Marge Webster moved the Wolfeboro Board of Selectmen to approve the temporary event permit for Kingswood Regional High School to hold the Prom Promenade through the Wolfeboro Community Bandstand and Cate Park to the MS Mount Washington on May 15, 2010 from 4:00-7:00 PM. Sarah Silk seconded. Being none opposed, the motion passed.

Member Linda Murray moved the Wolfeboro Board of Selectmen to approve the Bulk Vote as listed above. Marge Webster seconded.

DISCUSSION:

Mr. Owen provided the Board with an additional Land Use Change Tax in the amount of \$4,790 and the Board agreed to include it in the approval of the Bulk Vote.

<u>Linda Murray amended the motion to include the additional Land Use Change Tax submitted this evening.</u>
<u>Sarah Silk seconded.</u> Being none opposed, the motion passed.

New Business

A. Town Election Results

Ms. Silk thanked the voters for their support noting all their Warrant Articles prevailed except #14 & 16; she stated they appreciate their voting support in hard economic times.

Mrs. Murray provided an analysis of the Town Elections back to 2004. She reviewed a few highlights of the report. (See attached)

B. Road Improvements

Dave Ford joined the Board for discussion and explained he has received many complaints in regards to the condition of the roads, particularly Pleasant Valley Road. He explained they plan to some shim overlays on the roads to protect them, but the only way to deal with Pleasant Valley is to do what they did on North Line Road. He stated that they would not be able to do the whole road but the worst half would need to be redone and the other half would be reclaimed, regraded and paved. He reviewed his 2010 Road Improvement Budget estimate dated January 15, 2010 with the Board.

Mrs. Murray provided the members with pictures of the condition of Pleasant Valley Road and noted that it is in such poor condition that the road is barely passable and the residents have concerns about the damage that it will cause to their vehicles. She questioned if any sort of temporary fix to the extreme areas could be done, noting the warrant article will take at least 15 months.

Mr. Ford replied they could do a shim coat similar to what was done last year on 109 east by the State as a temporary fix.

Ms. Silk noted that Varney Road and Trask Mountain Road would benefit from the Hazardous Mitigation Grant.

Mrs. Murray stated she would like to see the Board spend the funds to make a temporary fix on Pleasant Valley Road.

Member Linda Murray moved the Wolfeboro Board of Selectmen to spend up to \$15,000 for a temporary repair to Pleasant Valley Road. Sarah Silk seconded. Being none opposed, the motion passed.

C. Fix a Leak Week

Mr. Ford reviewed the posters for Fix a Leak Week on promoting water conservation. He stated the flyers for the program can be found at Town Hall and are located on the Town's website www.wolfeboronh.us.

D. Summer Program Fees Parks and Recreation Department

Ethan Hipple joined the Board for discussion and explained that in his review of the cost of the programs he feels the programs are under priced. He reviewed his 2010 proposed increase in fees. He stated the 2009 revenue was \$58,958 and with the proposed increase in fees, he estimates revenue of \$72,993 for 2010.

Mrs. Murray expressed her concern of the large increase in the Summer Day Camp program, noting in her experience with the Wolfeboro Children Center and the cuts made by the State and that some families will not be able to afford the increase and would like to only increase this program to \$75.

Mr. Hipple replied that due to the demand they have also added an all day program as well. He stated in his review of surrounding towns and area camps the cost increase proposed would still be less than the average.

Ms. Silk questioned the scholarship program they had for families that needed assistance.

Mr. Hipple replied he is not aware of such program, but noted they do allow families to make payment arrangements.

Chairman Senecal questioned if they accounted for the two additional weeks school will be closed this year due to construction.

Mr. Hipple replied that they have various programs scheduled for those weeks.

Mrs. Murray questioned the swim team decrease for non-residents.

Mr. Hipple replied that based on a review of this program a large increase between resident and non-resident was not needed.

Mrs. Murray questioned if residents fill the programs first.

Mr. Hipple replied they do provide a 2-week window for residents to sign up first.

Ms. Silk stated she would like to see some fundraising done for a Scholarship Program.

Member Marge Webster moved the Wolfeboro Board of Selectmen to approve the fee schedule for the 2010 Parks and Recreation programs. Sarah Silk seconded.

DISCUSSION:

Mrs. Murray stated she would like to reduce the increase in the Summer Day Camp AM and PM program to \$75 for residents and \$150 non-residents.

Marge Webster amended the motion to change the Summer Day Camp AM and PM programs to \$75 for residents and \$150 for non-residents. Sarah Silk seconded. Being none opposed, the motion passed.

E. Milfoil Grant Application Letter of Commitment

Mr. Owen stated that the Board has been provided with two letters, the letter of Commitment for the Innovative Milfoil Control Demonstration Project and the joint application letter to be signed by the Board's Chairman.

Ken Marshner, Chairman of Milfoil Committee, joined the Board and explained that the Committee has applied for a grant to purchase a diver assisted suction harvesters that suck the Milfoil out of the water like a vacuum. He explained that Wolfeboro, Moultonborough and Tuftonboro are jointly applying for this grant to share the harvesters among the communities, with a \$5,000 commitment from each town. He stated the Milfoil Committee has made great progress in six years and is light years ahead of many other communities and appreciates all the support the Board has given them.

Ms. Silk thanked Mr. Marshner and Linda Murray for all their hard work on the Milfoil Committee.

Member Sarah Silk moved the Wolfeboro Board of Selectmen to approve and sign the letter committing \$ 5,000 of local funds toward the Innovative Milfoil Control Demonstration Project, and to authorize the Board's Chairman to sign the joint application letter on behalf of the Town of Wolfeboro. Linda Murray seconded.

DISCUSSION:

Mrs. Murray thanked Ken Marshner for all his help and knowledge on the Milfoil Committee and for all his hard work on this grant.

Being none opposed, the motion passed.

F. Emergency Management Plan Concurrence

Ms. Silk stated this annual form that needs to be signed by the Board.

Member Sarah Silk moved the Wolfeboro Board of Selectmen to approve and sign the Annual Concurrence with the Town's Emergency Operations Plan. Dave Senecal seconded. Being none opposed, the motion passed.

G. MS-2 Form Certificate of Appropriations

Pete Chamberlin joined the Board for discussion and explained that the town needs to certify to the State of NH the amount of money voted.

Member Linda Murray moved the Wolfeboro Board of Selectmen to approve and sign the MS-2Form-Certificate of Appropriations for 2010 in the amount of \$27,795,625. Marge Webster seconded. Being none opposed, the motion passed.

H. Monthly Budget review

Pete Chamberlin joined the Board for discussion and explained that in light of the favorable weather he compared the Highway Budget overtime to last year and it is running about even, but the Maintenance Supply account is down. He also reviewed the Brewster Hall electric budget and that budget is in good shape. He stated the Welfare Budget is also running about even.

Ms. Webster stated that the Executive Budget overtime line should be budgeted.

Mrs. Murray thanked Mr. Chamberlin for the reconciliation.

Ms. Webster questioned if he could provide an index for the budgets.

Mr. Chamberlin replied he would do that for next month.

Any Other Business

Ms. Silk questioned if the copies of the Town and City articles she requested at the last meeting were forwarded to the appropriate departments.

Mr. Owen would see it is done.

Ms. Webster questioned if the Town Manager was able to get a cost for plaques for elected officials that leave office, either by choice or they are defeated.

Mr. Owen replied that his Secretary was looking into such, but he believes it would not be a large cost item.

Member Marge Webster moved the Wolfeboro Board of Selectmen to purchase plaques for outgoing elected officials not to exceed \$100 each. Being no second, the motion failed.

Member Dave Senecal moved the Wolfeboro Board of Selectmen to direct Mr. Owen to purchase 3 plaques for outgoing elected officials this year not to exceed \$200. Linda Murray seconded.

DISCUSSION:

Ms. Silk questioned if this is for all elected officials.

Mr. Senecal clarified this for three people this year.

Being none opposed, the motion passed.

Member Marge Webster moved the Wolfeboro Board of Selectmen to purchase plaques for outgoing elected officials; those who choose not to run again will be presented at the Deliberative Session and those who are defeated will be presented at a Board of Selectmen meeting. Linda Murray seconded. Being none opposed, the motion passed.

Mrs. Webster questioned if they could encourage all employees to sign up for Direct Deposit.

Mr. Owen replied they could not require them do such, some employees feel strongly about receiving a paper check.

Mr. Storm stated that newly elected Police Commissioner Ron Goodgame inquired about having a Board of Selectmen representative at their monthly meeting and he volunteered to be that representative.

Town Manager's Report

Mr. Owen stated the following:

- The Town's pilings for the M.S Mount Washington are scheduled for repair.
- The Town has been awarded \$183,368 for the Safe Route to School program from NH DOT for sidewalks downtown and at the KRHS, McManus Road.
- The Town has been awarded a \$50,000 watershed grant from NHDES for Rust Pond.
- The Town received notice of funding available from stimulus money for the Energy Efficiency Block grant for energy and planning.
- They received \$64,394 from Metrocast Cablevision for the Franchise fee.
- He updated the US Department of Justice on the status of the Town elections and he provided the Board with a copy of that letter.
- He and the contract Assessor met with DRA last week and the current equalization rate is 102.9%, which means they are a little over assessed, but still within the acceptable range.
- He will be out of the office tomorrow morning.

Committee Reports

Ms. Silk stated the following:

- The Friends of Abenaki are seeking to raise \$100,000 for snowmaking of the slope and looked at a snow gun that could make snow on cross-country trails. She stated their annual pancake breakfast raised \$2,480.
- She planned on attending a lecture at the end of the month provided by the State, but at this point there is a long waiting list and they hope to hold another one.

Mrs. Murray stated the 250th Anniversary Committee met and she reviewed the copy of the commemorative booklet advertising costs. She stated they have had fantastic reception from the local businesses and are actively putting together events.

Questions from the Public

None.

Questions from the Press

Tom Beeler of the Granite State News questioned the revaluation update.

Mr. Owen explained that there would be a full revaluation in the fall.

Mrs. Murray noted that the State requires them to do one every five years and they are due this year.

Being no further business before the Board, Chairman Senecal entertained a motion to non-public session.

Member Marge Webster moved the Wolfeboro Board of Selectmen to non-public session at 8:18 PM to discuss personnel. Member Sarah Silk seconded. Roll call vote: Marge Webster-yes, Sarah Silk-yes, Dave Senecal-yes, Chuck Storm-yes and Linda Murray-yes, the motion passed.

The Board re-entered public session at 9:34 PM.

Chairman Senecal announced that the Board sealed the non-public minutes of March 17, 2010 by a 2/3rds vote as required by law.

Being no further business before the Board, Chairman Senecal entertained a motion to adjourn.

Member Dave Senecal moved the Wolfeboro Board of Selectmen to adjourn at 9:35 PM. Member Marge Webster seconded. Being none opposed, the motion passed.
