The applicant has requested to construct a single family dwelling and garage within the wetlands buffer.

Referencing the Martha Hogan Special Use Permit application, TM #237-11, the Wolfeboro Conservation Commission noted the following; due to insufficient information, the Commission is unable to provide advice as to whether we feel the proposal is acceptable. These reasons include but are not necessarily limited to; apparent incomplete and unstamped wetland delineation, the buffer boundary not noted and a grading plan not provided. If approved, the Commission requests natural vegetation be retained for as much of the wetland buffer as is feasible.

Minimum Impact Expedited

The applicant has requested to construct a 6' wide driveway access to a proposed garage at a private airport runway; requiring two wetland impacts. The impacts include a 9'X8' wooden bridge and a 18'X20' culvert with stone headwalls.

The Wolfeboro Conservation Commission cited no objection to the David Marshall III Minimum Impact Expedited application, TM #45-7 however, noted it appears that impact #2 is located on an abutting property that is separately owned.
